### COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTORS STATEMENT

The goal of this course is to help you extend your breadth of knowledge in areas of psychology beyond your main area of research/ dissertation and to advance academic skills. The course will target one field of psychology within the Carleton Psychology Department (cognitive, social, personality, health, developmental, applied, forensic) each month.

Generally, this course will meet Thursdays 2:30pm-4:00pm via online zoom class. The meetings include a lecture series of internal speakers (confirmed speakers this year: Dr. Deepthi Kamawar, Dr. Tim Pychyl) and external speakers or recorded lectures of external speakers, as well as workshops focusing on academic/practical skills (e.g., a CV building workshop, a non-academic writing workshop). Some of these lectures and workshops may be asynchronous and can be completed outside of scheduled class hours instead. The final schedule indicating which meetings are synchronous and which are asynchronous will be shared at the first day of classes and the instructor will send a weekly reminder email on Mondays.

The proseminar includes brief assignments associated with the workshops which are only mandatory for PhD students (but can be submitted by anyone). Examples: Edit/Submit your CV for feedback, Write a blog, Write a teaching philosophy statement, Give feedback on another students' writing.

### EVALUATION

This class is graded as satisfactory/unsatisfactory. MA students have to attend classes for a satisfactory grade. PhD students have to attend classes and complete six brief assignments marked as satisfactory for a satisfactory grade.
