### COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This Advanced Topics course will focus on “Judgment and Decision-Making” (JDM). JDM is an area of study that could indeed be regarded as one that cuts across all other domains of Psychology. From deciding whether to move to Finland to deciding which cookie to eat next, people spend much of their days making decisions. Accordingly, a very rich background of classic psychological research has been dedicated to issues such as how people make decisions, what is the best way to make decisions, and how people tend to think about and deal with uncertainty and risk. You will come away from this course with intimate knowledge of that rich background.

The course (in person Fri. 2:30 – 5:30) will be seminar-based with weekly discussions based on weekly chapter readings from the text listed below (along with 1-2 related journal article readings that will be made available on-line).

### EVALUATION (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

Marks will be based on:

1. Submitting written answers each week to a few questions based on the weekly chapter readings.
2. Being responsible for presenting one (or part of one) of the chapters to the class and leading the discussion of that chapter material.
3. Also presenting one of the related journal article readings to the class.
4. Writing a term paper related to one of the topics covered.
