COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This seminar is designed to prepare students to complete an honours thesis or project in psychology, using a social psychology context. We will address methodological advances and current controversies in social psychology research and develop research questions that we will address by collecting data and testing hypotheses. Roughly one-half of the course will be devoted to reviewing and discussing current theories and issues in social psychology. The other half will be devoted to the pragmatics of designing and conducting research: Students will conduct an empirical study on a topic of their choice in small groups. Students will gain experience in: finding and evaluating peer-reviewed research literature; formulating hypotheses and designing studies to test them; analyzing results using statistical procedures and software; orally presenting the work for feedback; and writing using APA style. During the course of these tasks, students will become familiar with conceptual frameworks and research issues in social psychology. Requirements include: preparation for, and attendance and participation in, classes and labs; in class and take-home assignments; group work; group oral presentations; group ethics proposal; individually written research proposal; and individually written final research report. Although the content focus of this course is social psychology, skills learned should facilitate honours thesis or project completion in other content areas of psychology (e.g., personality, health, organizational).

EVALUATION (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

There are no exams or tests, but students will prepare oral presentations (individually and/or in groups) and submit several written assignments. Class participation contributes significantly to the grade.

TEXT

There is no textbook, but each week students will read selected journal articles and chapters, which will be posted on Brightspace
