COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

Against the backdrop of health psychology, this seminar prepares students to complete an honours capstone project (honours project or honours thesis) in psychology.

The seminar portion of the course largely involves discussing assigned readings. Students are expected to actively participate in these group discussions every week.

The lab portion of the course largely involves completing a year-long research project. The research project will be completed in groups. Given the scope of the research project, lab attendance is required.

Using health psychology research as a platform, students will gain experience locating, evaluating, and orally discussing peer-reviewed literature; developing research questions and hypotheses; designing research studies; considering ethical implications of research; using statistical software (SPSS) to organize and analyze data; writing an APA-style research report; and giving research presentations.

EVALUATION (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

This is a writing intensive and discussion intensive course. Evaluation is based on writing assignments, participation in weekly seminar discussions, leading discussions, lab work, quizzes, and presentations.
