COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This course provides students with the opportunity to critically evaluate evidence-based theories and practice for the successful reintegration of justice impacted youth and adults through a gender (men, women, and gender diverse populations will be considered) and culturally informed lens. Special topics will include: the risk-need-responsivity model, desistance and good lives frameworks, trauma-based approaches, and hot topics in bail reform, prisons, and community corrections.

EVALUATION

Students will be invited to participate in traditional forms of academic evaluation (e.g., write papers, give presentations, engage in thoughtful discussions with peers) as well as participate in experiential forms of learning (e.g. create a Wikipedia page for a gender responsive expert, develop a gender responsive program module).
