### COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

How do we judge other people's personalities? Do we have insight into how other people perceive our personality? What factors affect the accuracy or inaccuracy of our perceptions? In this course, we explore such questions on self-knowledge and interpersonal perception through the lens of personality psychology. The course will cover a variety of topics including our perceptions of ourselves and other people, the accuracy of our perceptions, how accuracy arises, and individual differences in these processes. Other topics include our understanding of how other people experience us, feeling understood, and authenticity.

### EVALUATION (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

Evaluation will take place in the form of participating in and leading in-class discussions, an oral presentation, and a final research proposal paper.
