COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

The goal of this course is to provide a critical review of the various topics related to forensic psychology from police investigations to profiling and serial murder. This course aims to answer key questions such as: How do police officers conduct interrogations? How accurate is eyewitness testimony? How do we measure psychopathy? Together, we will explore these questions and others through the evaluation of scientific research and the examination of specific case studies. In-class activities will include lectures, discussions, and videos.
