COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This course provides a broad overview of the psychology of criminal conduct. A variety of topics are discussed and critically evaluated. The first half of the course deals with a number of general issues, including measuring criminal activity, theories of crime, risk assessment, and treatment. The second half of the course focuses on several special justice-involved populations. The following special populations are examined: justice-involved youth, individuals who commit violent crime, individuals with mental disorder who come in contact with the justice system, individuals with psychopathic traits, individuals who commit sexual offences, and justice-involved women.
