Rebuilding First Nations Governance Project

Looking for a chance to expand and hone your communications expertise? The [Rebuilding First Nations Governance Project](#) has an opening for a student with initiative and creativity to help carry out its Knowledge Mobilization and Communications activities. Ideal students will be in communications or journalism and have some experience with public affairs, social media and/or writing for the web.

Rebuilding First Nations Governance (RFNG) is a national alliance of First Nation communities and Tribal Councils, academic researchers and public sector practitioners created to support First Nations leadership and rights holders that have made the decision to transition out from under the Indian Act to their own inherent rights governance. This multi-year applied action research project is led from Carleton University and supported by a Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) Partnership Grant.

Under the direction of the project manager, duties include researching and writing content for social media and the web; managing the RFNG website and social media accounts; contributing to the development and implementation of new communications activities to promote the project and its research findings to Indigenous and general audiences.

You will be working with a congenial and collegial team of Indigenous and non-Indigenous partners, along with other students from across the country.

Pay is \$25/hour for up to 10 hours a week.

In addition to the skills necessary for position, preferred applications will be able to demonstrate a good knowledge of Indigenous peoples and issues in Canada. Competitive applicants will be expected to provide a portfolio of work and demonstrate their abilities through an interview process.
