



Open Contract Position - Survey Facilitator

We are looking for a facilitator to execute a survey at and about fishing derbies in inland Eeyou Istchee in summer/fall 2022.

Project description

As a part of FISHES (Fostering Indigenous Small-scale fisheries for Health, Economy, and food Security), a collaboration between Northern Indigenous organizations, universities, and government agencies, we are conducting surveys at fishing derbies throughout Eeyou Istchee. The survey asks participants about their experiences with and views on fishing derbies. This research will inform local entities about attitudes towards fishing derbies and how derbies contribute to the local economy and food security. The survey was endorsed by the Eeyou Istchee Research Advisory Board with representation from the Cree Nation Government, the Cree Trappers' Association, the Cree Nation of Mistissini, the Cree Nation of Waswanipi, the Eeyou Marine Region Wildlife Board, and the Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay. The successful candidate will visit select fishing derbies (usually weekends) in inland communities of Eeyou Istchee to distribute the survey. There is an opportunity for downtime during each derbies during which the facilitator may visit with relatives or otherwise take time off.

Per derby salary: \$22.50/hour (+ gas and accommodation)

Job description:

- staff survey booth and distribute survey (paper and electronic copies) at fishing derbies in Eeyou Istchee inland communities
- record general information about derbies
- participate in training related to human subject research

Who we are looking for:

- comfortable talking to project partners and derby participants

- comfortable with overnight travel
- available on weekends
- must possess a valid driving license and vehicle
- fishing experience an asset
- ability to speak Cree an asset
