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**Items for Approval**

SCCASP has reviewed and is recommending to Senate approval of major modifications to undergraduate regulations for the following programs:

B.A. in Women's and Gender Studies  
Bachelor of Data Science (B.D.S.)  
Bachelor of Economics (B. Econ.)  
Bachelor of Humanities (B.Hum.) and the Bachelor of Journalism and Humanities (B.J.Hum.)  
Bachelor of Music (B.Mus.)

All items have been recommended by their academic units and reviewed and recommended by their Faculty Boards.

A summary of the changes and individual motions is below. A single omnibus motion is presented in the interest of efficiency. Senators may request to pull any of the proposed changes out of the omnibus motion for individual consideration.

Senators are encouraged to read the accompanying Courseleaf documents prior to the Senate meeting, as they will be voting on the Courseleaf language as presented.

## Summary of Changes and Individual Motions

### 1. B.A. Honours in Women's and Gender Studies

The introduction of a new co-op option to the B.A. Honours in Women's & Gender Studies to allow students to develop experiential learning skills and showcase the program's transferable skills.

### 2. Bachelor of Data Science (B.D.S.)

The addition of specific course requirements to satisfy the Bachelor of Data Science co-op work term eligibility, ensuring that students have foundational skills in computer science, data science, and statistics.

### 3. Bachelor of Economics (B.Econ.)

The addition of two new courses (ECON 2210 and ECON 2900) to the course requirements for the Bachelor of Economics co-op work term eligibility, replacing two courses (ECON 2030 and ECON 2103) that are no longer offered.

### 4. Bachelor of Humanities (B.Hum.) and Bachelor of Journalism and Humanities (B.J.Hum.)

Update to the Academic Continuation Evaluation (ACE) requirements for the Bachelor of Humanities and Bachelor of Journalism and Humanities: All required HUMS courses will now be included in the core CGPA calculation for ACE assessment.

## 5. Bachelor of Music (B.Mus.)

### 2. Academic Schedule for 2026-27

One of the responsibilities of SCCASP is to, “approve annually the undergraduate and graduate academic schedules within the Guidelines for Determining the Academic Year as set and amended from time to time by Senate” (see attached). As such, at its last meeting SCCASP

reviewed and approved the Academic Schedule for the 2026-27 academic year. Note that because Labour Day falls at the end rather than the beginning of the first week of September 2026, in order to conform to Senate Guidelines we were unable to accommodate a break between the last day of Fall classes and the start of the examination period. (Normally, the schedule provides for at least one day off.) Scheduling and Examination Services will take this into account when scheduling Fall 2026 final exams.

Summary The change simply reflects the addition of specific course requirements to satisfy Co-op Work Term eligibility; namely the inclusion of the requirement that students must have successfully completed COMP 1406, DATA 1519, STAT 1500, and either DATA 2200 or DATA 2500.

Rationale for change The change is necessary to ensure an appropriate background level in the areas of computer science, data science, and statistics as a condition for Co-op Work Term approval. After successful completion of COMP 1406, students will have achieved a satisfactory level of computer programming skills. DATA 1519 and its prerequisite DATA 1517 will ensure mastery of a wide array of statistical techniques. Students will also gain knowledge of the use of the R statistical software in STAT 1500, adding further to their programming skills. Finally, the choice between DATA 2200 and DATA 2500 allows students to add breadth to their background in terms of either the enhancement of communication skills, or in data cleaning, manipulation, and visualization.

Implementation

It is possible that a B Math Honours student may transfer into the BDS program after their second year. For such students STAT 2655 and STAT 2559 are suitable replacements for DATA 1517 and DATA 1519.

At each ACE assessment, Bachelor of Humanities students are evaluated on the basis of their Overall CGPA. The Core CGPA is assessed only at the end of each winter term.

Students are *Eligible to Continue* (EC) if the Overall CGPA is at least 6.50 and the Core CGPA is at least 6.50.

A student who does not receive the status *Eligible to Continue* (EC) but who has an Overall CGPA of at least 6.00 and a Core CGPA of at least 6.00 is placed on *Academic Warning* (AW).

A student is required to leave the program with the decision *Continue in Alternate* (CA) if:

1. the student was on *Academic Warning* (AW) and does not achieve *Eligible to Continue* (EC) at the next ACE assessment,
- or**
2. the student has an Overall CGPA of less than 6.00 or a Core CGPA of less than 6.00 when assessed.

**Transfer from B.Hum. to B.J.Hum.**

A student who has completed the first year of the B.Hum. and is *Eligible to Continue* (EC) may apply to transfer into the second year of the B.J. Hum. and will be accepted at the discretion of the School of Journalism and the College of Humanities, and must normally have an overall CGPA of 10.0 (A-) or higher. Transfers into higher years will not be considered.

Whenever a student is assessed in ACE, Bachelor of Journalism and Humanities students are evaluated on the basis of their Overall CGPA. The Humanities Core CGPA is assessed only at the end of each winter term.

1. A student is required to leave the program if:
  1. the student was on *Academic Warning (AW)* and does not achieve a decision of *Eligible to Continue (EC)* at the next Academic Continuation Evaluation;
  2. the student's Overall CGPA is less than 1.00;
  3. the student's Humanities Core CGPA is less than 6.00 when assessed.
2. Students who have completed between 5.5 and 15 credits who do not maintain an Overall CGPA of 4.00 and a Humanities Core CGPA of 6.5, but who have an Overall CGPA of at least 1.00 and a Humanities Core of at least 6.00,

will be placed on *Academic Warning (AW)*. Students who have completed at least 15.5 credits and who do not meet the graduation requirements of an Overall CGPA of 6.50, a Journalism Major CGPA of 6.50, and a Humanities Core CGPA of 6.50 will be required to leave the program.
