Class and laboratory preparations, departmental introductions for students, and other academic preparation activities will be held. September 4, 2024 Fall term begins. Full fall, early fall, and fall/winter classes begin. September 10, 2024 Last day for registration and course changes (including auditing) in early fall courses. September 17, 2024 Last day for registration and course changes (including auditing) in full fall, late fall, and fall/winter courses. Last day to withdraw from early fall courses with a full fee adjustment. Graduate students who have not electronically submitted their final thesis copy to the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Affairs will not be eligible to graduate in fall 2024 and must register for the fall 2024 term. September 20-22, 2024 Full summer and late summer term deferred final examinations will be held. September 30, 2024 Last day to withdraw from full fall and fall/winter courses with a full fee adjustment. October 1, 2024 Last day for academic withdrawal from early fall courses. Last day to request Formal Examination Accommodations for Oct/Nov final examinations from the Paul Menton Centre for Students with Disabilities. Note that it may not be possible to fulfil accommodation requests received after the specified deadlines.
