The Academic Year - 2017-18 2018-2019 Dates and Deadlines

This schedule contains the dates prescribed by the University Senate for academic activities. Dates relating to fee payment, cancellation of course selections, late charges, and other fees or charges will be published in the Important Dates and Deadlines section of the Registration Website (<u>carleton.ca/registration</u>).

The academic year is divided into three terms:

Summer term: May - August Fall term: September - December Winter term: January – April

Courses are offered in the following patterns:

Early summer: May - June
Late summer: July - August
Full summer: May - August
Fall term: September - December
Winter term: January - April
Fall/winter: September - April

Courses are offered during the day and in the evening.

Credential

An academic qualification awarded by the University Senate upon successful completion of an academic program. All credentials are either degrees (bachelor's, master's, or doctoral), diplomas, or certificates.

Program

A specified combination of academic requirements in a discipline or intellectual area of study which leads to a credential (e.g., B.A. in Philosophy, Ph.D. in History, M.Sc. in Chemistry, M.Eng. in Civil Engineering, Graduate Diploma in Public Policy and Program Evaluation, Certificate in the Teaching of English as a Second Language).

Element

Elements are: (i) Undergraduate: majors, minors, concentrations, and specializations; there are a maximum number of elements that may be taken in conjunction with a program at the undergraduate level; (ii) Graduate: concentrations. Elements are recorded on the transcript and the diploma.

Option

An optional addition to or component of a program with requirements distinct from those of an Element: (i) Undergraduate: co-operative education, study abroad, Mention Francais, program internship; (ii) Graduate: co-operative education, Cotutelle (in Ph.D. programs), Dual Master's Degree (in master's programs), collaborative specialization. Options may be taken in addition to elements and are recorded on the transcript and the diploma.

Pathway

A pathway through a program is a route to completion such as: stream, thesis, research essay, research project, or course only. Pathways may be chosen in addition to Elements and Options, and are not recorded on the transcript or diploma.

Academic Nomenclature

It is proposed that Carleton adopt a consistent, uniform classification to describe and categorize programs of study. Credential

Program

A specified combination of academic requirements in a discipline or intellectual area of study which leads to a credential (e.g., B_A_ in Philosophy, Ph_D_ in History, M_Sc_ in Chemistry, M.Eng. in Civil Engineering, Graduate Diploma in Public Policy and Program Evaluation; Certificate in the Teaching of English as a Second Language).

Element

A mandatory or optional set of courses, or other academic activity, that may form part of a program. Elements are: (i) Undergraduate: majors, minors, concentrations, and specializations; there are a maximum number of elements that may be taken in conjunction with a program at the undergraduate level; (ii) Graduate: concentrations. Elements are recorded on the transcript and the diploma.

Option

An optional addition to <u>or component of</u> a program with <u>distinct</u>-requirements <u>distinct</u>-from those of an Element: (i) Undergraduate: co-operative education, study abroad, Mention Francais, <u>program internship</u>; (ii) Graduate: co-operative education, Cotutelle (in Ph.D. programs), <u>Dual Master's Degree (in master's programs)</u>, <u>collaborative specialization</u>. Options may be taken in addition to elements and are recorded on the transcript and the diploma.

Pathway

A pathway through a program that is a route to completion such as: (e.g., stream, thesis, research essay, research project, or course only; accelerated pathway from bachelor's program to master's program); or a focused area of study constituting a route to completion that is not recognized as a concentration or specialization. Pathways may be chosen in addition to eElements and Options, and but are not recorded on the transcript or diploma.
