#### Summary

Closing the DCR-67 program officially. This program has not been operational since 2019. The program contains no students and offers no courses. This program has been suspended (not offering courses, nor accepting students) for approx. 5 years. In 2019, after a three year pilot project the program did not attract enough students to justify its continuation. This was the trend over the three year term of this pilot project. The DCR-67 program and courses have not been offered since that time.

While there was significant interest in the area of conflict resolution in general, the department determined that the structure of the program , it's requirements and costs were no longer feasible.

Rationale for change

Previously known as the Graduate Certificate in Conflict Resolution program, the DCR-67 program (Graduate Diploma in Conflict Resolution was relaunched as a three year pilot project in 2016. At the conclusion of the pilot project, due to continued dwindling interest, the department decided to suspend all new admissions. Since that time, the program has existed on paper only, with no admissions, no students and no courses offered. All faculty that had previously taught in the GDCR have since retired and we cannot offer the relevant courses without new faculty hires. Due to this the department has decided to officially close and deactivate this program.

Thus, we made the decision to move summative assessment of COMS 6000 into that course itself, remove the first comprehensive exam, and revise the second. 2. New course codes have been added for the two fields comprising the new comprehensive exam requirement. Per our survey of doctoral programs in communication, our "second"

comprehensive exam was already roughly equivalent to the entire comprehensive exams requirement at other comparable programs. Consequently, we have made each field of the new comprehensive exam worth 0.5 credits. The exams are to be written concurrently by full-time students but may be written consecutively by part-time students. 3. At present, students are required to write and defend a dissertation proposal, but this is done as part of the 0.0 credit COMS 6909 PhD Thesis. We feel this does not adequately communicate to students the significance and value of the intellectual work involved in designing a dissertation project and have therefore proposed the greater formalization of the proposal requirement in the new COMS 6908 PhD Thesis Proposal course code. Adding a distinct course code for the proposal will also enable better tracking of students progress, since (non-)completion of COMS 6908 can be tracked in Banner and will be visible on individual students' audits.

#### Transition/Implementation

Students already in the doctoral program when the new calendar comes into effect will have already completed at least one of the old comprehensive exams; therefore, they will not be permitted to transition to the new formats and program structure. The old comprehensive exam course codes (COMS 6900 and COMS 6901) will be retained in the calendar until all inprogram students registered in them have completed.

Consequently, we have made each field of the new comprehensive exam worth 0.5 credits. The exams are to be written concurrently by fulltime students but may be written consecutively by part-time students. 3. At present, students are required to write and defend a dissertation proposal, but this is done as part of the 0.0 credit COMS 6909 PhD Thesis. We feel this does not adequately communicate to students the significance and value of the intellectual work involved in designing a dissertation project and have therefore proposed the greater formalization of the proposal requirement in the new COMS 6908 PhD Thesis Proposal course code. Adding a distinct course code for the proposal will also enable better tracking of students progress, since (non-)completion of COMS 6908 can be tracked in Banner and will be visible on individual students' audits.

# Rationale for change

#### Transition/Implementation

Students already in the doctoral program when the new calendar comes into effect will have already completed at least one of the old comprehensive exams; therefore, they will not be permitted to transition to the new formats and program structure. The old comprehensive exam course codes (COMS 6900 and COMS 6901) will be retained in the calendar until all inprogram students registered in them have completed.
