Summary

In order to incorporate the 32 additional competencies approved from RN prescribing that came in from the province (late) Sept 2025, content was added and we are adjusting the credit value of courses to accurately reflect the additional heavy workload. This requires global adjustment to other courses within the program to accommodate (including removal of quarter credits as a global request from the RO to be prioritized).

Rationale for change

The late proposed curriculum modification is necessary to ensure that the credit weighting of the courses accurately reflects the instructional time, assessment load, and accreditation requirements associated with Registered Nurse Prescribing competencies. The Registered Nurse Prescribing Accreditation Standards were only approved in the summer term of 2025, after the program curriculum had been designed and approved, and only months before our first cohort began. Following the first delivery of both courses during the Winter 2026 term, it became evident that both NURS 1004 and NURS 1100, both of which teach and assess RN Prescribing learning outcomes, were each delivered at a level equivalent to a 0.5 credit course rather than a 0.25 credit course.

Transition/Implementation

Current students have already completed the majority of these courses, with the exception of NURS 3010 which has been increased from 0.25 to 0.5. The Registrar's Office is aware of program credit changes between our current and incoming cohorts if changes are approved for 26-27..

Modification Description

We are requesting that the 0.25 credit courses **NURS 1004 Pharmacology and Medication Management** and **NURS 1100 Simulation 1** be replaced by the 0.5 credit courses **NURS 1005** and **NURS 1101** (same name, respectively). The late proposed curriculum modification is necessary to ensure that the credit weighting of the courses accurately reflects the instructional time, assessment load, and accreditation requirements associated with Registered Nurse Prescribing competencies. The Registered Nurse Prescribing Accreditation Standards were only approved in the summer term of 2025, after the program curriculum had been designed and approved, and only months before our first cohort began. Following the first delivery of both courses during the Winter 2026 term, it became evident that both NURS 1004 and NURS 1100, both of which teach and assess RN Prescribing learning outcomes, were each delivered at a level equivalent to a 0.5 credit course rather than a 0.25 credit course.

In order to adequately cover and assess the newly required curriculum content, both courses required weekly 3-hour in-person instructional sessions, extensive formative assessment activities throughout the term, and significant summative evaluations including midterms and final examinations. The instructional and assessment demands substantially exceeded the expectations and workload normally associated with a 0.25 credit course. Keeping the current credit designation would therefore inaccurately represent the academic workload required of students and the instructional resources required for delivery.

If the proposed late curriculum changes are not approved, several significant academic and administrative challenges will arise. Most importantly, maintaining the current course credit structure would continue an inequitable workload model identified during the program's first implementation. In Winter 2026, the first cohort completed the equivalent workload of six full-term courses while receiving recognition for only 2.5 credits. Evaluation of the first delivery cycle demonstrated that this workload exceeded reasonable expectations for first-year students. As a result, the program has determined that the second cohort should no longer be required to complete an elective during the Winter term in order to better align workload expectations with student success (further detail under "Student Impact").

Failure to approve the revised credit values would also create inconsistencies between cohorts within the same program. The second cohort would progress through a modified curriculum while formally accumulating a different number of credits than the first cohort. This would create complications related to degree progression and graduation requirements, potentially resulting in students graduating with

incomplete credit totals or requiring credit overloads during later terms that already include intensive clinical placements (See Impacts on Learning Outcomes and Curriculum Mapping below).

Denying the late changes would also create a substantial administrative burden. The proposed compensatory curriculum changes would require manual audit adjustments for both the initial cohort of approximately 90 students and the anticipated second cohort of more than 130 students in order to reconcile differences in credit totals and progression requirements. Implementing individualized adjustments at this scale would place an unreasonable burden on the Registrar's Office and complicate ongoing program administration. In speaking with the Registrar's Office, a plan to adjust the credits and audits of the first cohort of students is being devised but at this time lacks any precedent.

This program represents a highly novel initiative within the university context. As the institution's first accredited health program, the curriculum was developed without extensive internal precedent or established institutional models for comparison. Furthermore, the program was designed and developed by a single individual within an accelerated timeline as a compressed program structure, requiring the integration of substantial professional accreditation requirements into a condensed curriculum format. Given these circumstances, thoughtful and responsive curriculum refinements following initial implementation are both reasonable and expected as part of responsible program development and continuous quality improvement.

Approval of this change for the 2026–27 academic year is necessary to ensure equitable and accurate credit assignment for the program's second student cohort. Without approval, the institution would be required to retroactively adjust course credit values after delivery in order to fairly recognize student workload and achievement. Given the anticipated increase in enrolment to approximately 130 students in the next cohort, retroactive modifications would create a substantial administrative and academic burden for students, faculty, and administrative staff.

Impact on Other Programs

We are only making changes to NURS courses, which are restricted to NURS students only. The one potential impact to other programs is that we are moving one elective option from the winter term to the summer term in their first year.

Impact on Learning Outcomes and Curriculum Map

In response to the required increase of 0.5 credit in total for the first-year winter term, as well as in response to the request of reducing 0.25 credit courses, we are proposing the following changes to 0.25 credit courses:

Note that both NURS 2018 Simulation III and NURS 2004 Pharmacology & Med Management II have already been adjusted from 0.25 to 0.5 credits; this change was requested in October 2025 for impact in the 2026-27 academic year after RN Prescribing was approved for the program in Summer 2025.

We were planning on making future changes to 0.25 credit courses in the normative time frame, however after the clear overload of course content in the winter 2026 term, we are requesting approval for this late change, along with the compensatory changes.

With the changes approved, students in the second cohort will take fewer courses in the summer 2027 term, have fewer 0.25 credit courses overall, and the only changes to upper year courses include new assessments in order to formally assess the Learning Outcomes originally assessed in the summer 2000-level courses.

Student Impact

Our first cohort of nursing student experienced the full impact of the current course build in that they completed both Pharmacology & Medication Management I and Simulation I at full 0.5 credit loads as opposed to their 0.25 credit designation to incorporate all required content. These **first-year students completed the equivalent of 3.0 credits in their second term of study** with one 0.5 credit course being a clinical practicum that required 6-hour shifts at our clinical partner. While our students were successful, **many students, including those considered high-achieving students did report struggling with the course load.** While it is normative for first year students to experience a workload adaption, it is not normative for first year students to complete overloads of 3.0 credits. Given the nursing program is condensed over 3 years, setting students up for success with a regular course load of 2.5 credits each term is imperative to student wellbeing and retention. With the complexity and structure of the program, if we delay in making these credit changes, the second cohort of students entering in fall 2026 will also be impacted by a course work overload of 3.0 credits in their second term of study.

It has been suggested that students can move the overloaded winter elective to a later term. There are only two other terms where students have less than 2.5 credits already required in the term. They are:

1. Term 3 (Summer following first year) – there are currently 2.0 credits scheduled in this term. This is the first summer term following their first year of study. Adding an additional credit to this term is not advisable from a student success standpoint; having just completed their first year, these students have no time and space to recuperate following a challenging first year. Additionally, the 0.5 credit cushion is an opportunity for any students who may not have completed the full course load successfully in their first year (e.g. failed or withdrew from a course) to re-take a course with significant academic advising and support, in order to stay within the programme.
2. Term 9 (last summer term third year) – the only course schedule for the last summer term is NURS 4200 Clinical Consolidation II. This clinical course has students working between 250-400 hours in a clinical setting, making it an unreasonable expectation for students to complete an elective course at the same time.
