The Academic Advising Centre provides advising information for students on a dropin basis.

- Audit: Online tool that overviews courses required to complete your degree at Carleton. Includes grades earned for completed courses
- APE: Evaluation of students cumulative grade point average (CGPA). Completed at the end of each winter term to ensure students are meeting minimum grade requirements
- ASR: Online tool for students that highlights graduation requirements and potential obstacles of degree completion





Academic Advising Centre

- Academic Advisors can meet with students to discuss potential program changes as well as advise students who have transfer credits
- Assist students with developing degree completion plans if struggling academically
