




All wet food waste from Residence Commons is sent for composting.

Bio-degradable cutlery was introduced and bio-degradable and recyclable packaging is used in most of the outlets.
















Carleton University has established a Sustainable Energy Research Centre (CSERC) that will conduct world-class research into sustainable energy.






In Fall 2010, Carleton introduced a new stream in Computer Science that focuses on Mobile and Social Networking Applications.

The courses have no lectures, but instead have labs in which students will learn through "hands-on" experience, under the guidance of their teachers and in collaboration with their classmates.




