- Tuition fees vary based on area of study, year of study, and international or domestic student status
- Fee amount can be found on your student account through Carleton Central
- Canadian citizens and permanent residents
 - \$7,210 - \$11,755
- International Students
 - \$27,282 - \$36,863

- Some fees are mandatory such as the UPASS, Health Insurance, and Athletics fee
- Some fees are optional such as the CKCU, Clubs and Societies, and Charlatan fee
- Students determine which optional fees they would like to pay during course registration

Entrance Scholarships

- Awarded based on academic merit
- Admission average of 80% or higher
- No application requirement – assessed at time of admission
- Must maintain annual average of 80% to renew scholarship

Scholarships	Value	Admission Average
\$16,000	\$4,000 x four years	Renewable 95-100%
\$12,000	\$3,000 x four years	Renewable 90-94.9%
\$8,000	\$2,000 x four years	Renewable 85-89.9%
\$4,000	\$1,000 x four years	Renewable 80-84.9%

- Financial award based on financial need rather than academic achievement
- Supplementary source of funding for students
- Entrance bursaries (new students) and general bursaries (all students) available

- Provide students with additional funds to help meet the direct educational costs of first-year studies
- Deadline to apply was June 30th

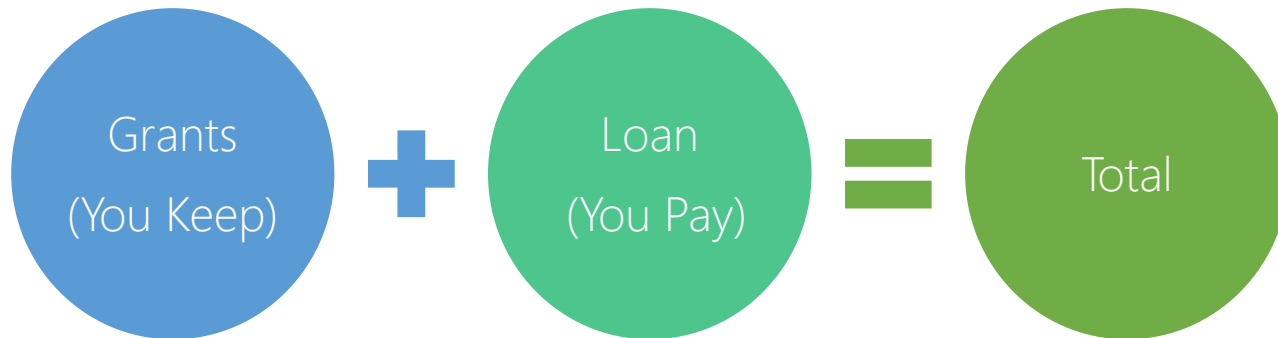

 - Educational expenses & personal financial situation



- Basic eligibility requirements
 - Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person
 - Meet Ontario's provincial residency requirements
 - Be enrolled in a degree, diploma, or certificate program that is approved for OSAP
- What is a full-time student according to OSAP?

Credits/Term	Course Load	OSAP Funding Available
2.0 or more credits	100%	Full-time
1.5 credits	60%	Full-time
1.0 credits	40%	Part-time, or full-time for students with a permanent disability
0.5 credits	20%	Part-time

- Opportunity to work part-time on campus
- For students receiving OSAP or similar financial aid
- Application available through Carleton Central on August 28th

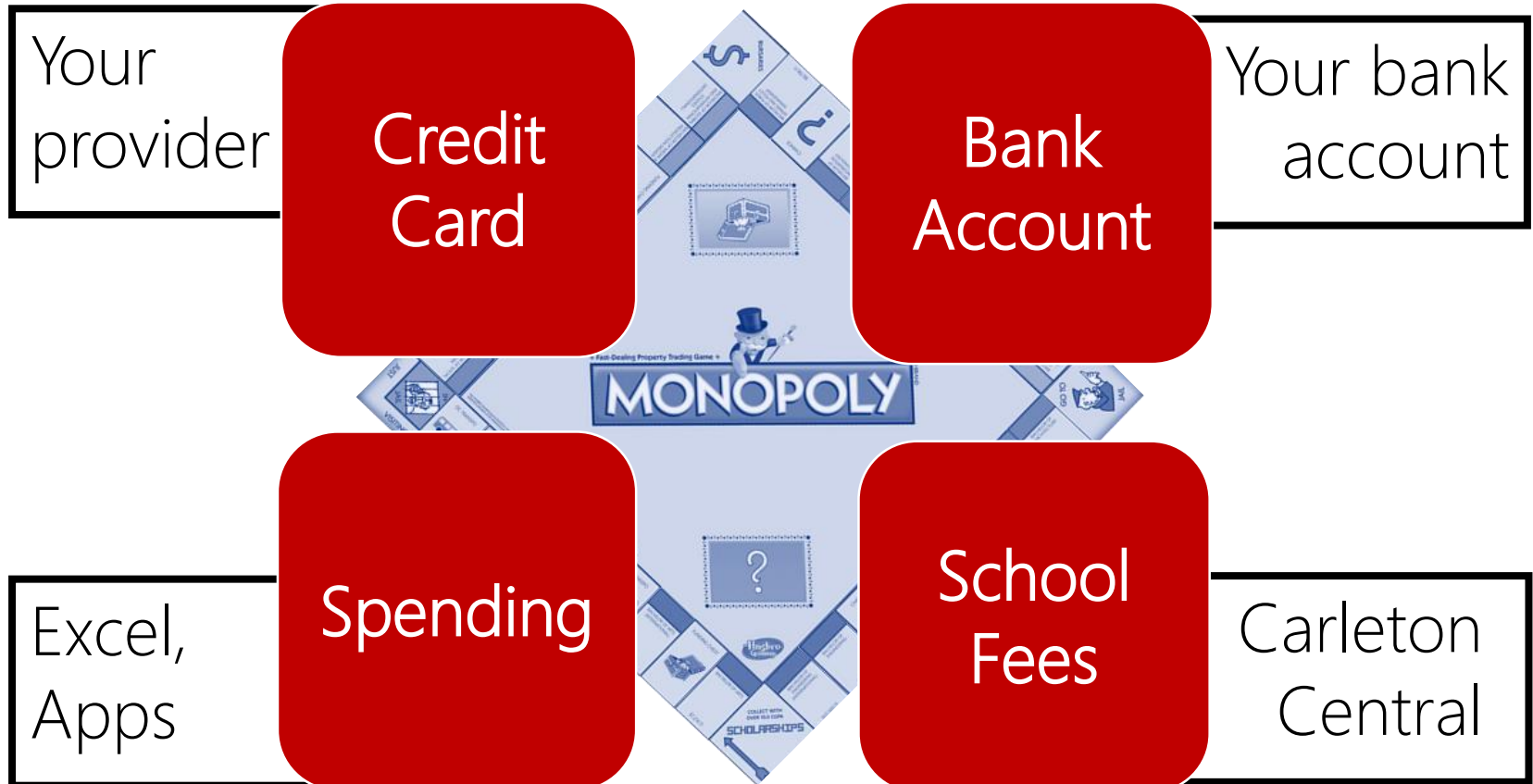
