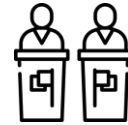

2. Academic Societies

Many academic programs have an academic society or club for students that are studying in that program.

- Examples include: Sprott Business Student Society, Science Student Society, and the Neuroscience Society
- Students can get involved by attending events, volunteering at events, or applying for a leadership role such as 'Vice President Finance' within the society



3. Religious/Cultural Groups

There are a variety of religious and cultural groups led by Carleton students that are open to all students. Examples include:

- Muslim Students Association that host events such as Islam Awareness Week and Ramadan and Iftar programming
- H.O.L.A.S. – Latin American student group that host events such as weekly Salsa lessons and Spanish lessons



4. Not-for-profit/charity groups

There are a variety of not-for-profit groups on campus that host events to raise awareness and fundraise for initiatives, such as:

- Relay for Life: annual fundraiser for Canadian Cancer Society. March 13, 2020
- AIESEC: Provides students with international leadership experiences



5. Political Groups

Students can also become involved in groups that align with political parties to meet students with shared interests.

- Carleton Young Liberals: host events such as a Multipartisan Debate
- Carleton Conservatives: host events such as networking events
- Carleton New Democrats: host events such as Carleton Model Parliament

6. Special Interest Clubs

There is a wide range of special interest clubs that students can explore. Examples include:

- CU Dance Club

 - Origami Club
