Our Community


- Consists of students, student-staff & professional staff members who work to build welcoming & inclusive communities

- 5 kilometers of heated, underground tunnels connect the University's buildings
- Our Residence program is awardwinning
- In 1969 Renfrew House became the first co-educational residence of its kind in Canada

Roommates & Conflicts

Community Developers

- Plan residence-wide events & initiatives for the greater Residence community
- Facilitate programs to encourage student participation while fostering student engagement & relationship building

Residence Managers

- Full-time supervisors of the Residence Fellows
- Act as an additional support for students & promote a positive community living environment
- On a 24/7 rotating on-call schedule for support and emergency response

Community Managers

- Support and engage students in the Residence-wide community
- Facilitate and support the organization and implementation of Residencewide initiatives and events, including overseeing the Raven's Roost
- On a 24/7 rotating on-call for student support and emergencies



Additional Supports

Residence Counselling

- Confidential counselling for all Residence students
- The office & our wellness space are located in Renfrew House

Attendant Services

- 24/7 program for students with special needs
- Promotes an independent lifestyle by providing personal support

Housing & Residence Life

The Caf

- All access meals for students living in residence
- Fresh meals prepared in front of you
- Many dietary accommodations:
 - Nut-free, vegetarian, vegan, gluten- and lactose-free options, Halal and more
- Boxed lunches can be ordered ahead
- Themed meals such as 'Harry Potter night'
- Sustainability efforts
