

# Our Community


- Consists of students, student-staff & professional staff members who work to build welcoming & inclusive communities

## Did You Know?

- Home to over 3,600 students and countless groundhogs

- Students who live in Residence are 1.4x more likely to continue to the next academic year than those who live off-campus

#### Residence Fellows

- Upper year students who live in our communities to provide support and guidance to students
- Promote community engagement through a variety of activities and educational opportunities
- On a daily rotating on-call schedule from 9pm-7am each day

### Community Advisors

- Upper year students with previous Residence Life experience
- Recognize students who positively contribute to our Residence community
- Additional support for students and fellow Residence Life Staff



## The Residence Life Staff

### Community Developers

- Plan residence-wide events and initiatives for the greater Residence community
- Facilitate programs to encourage student participation while fostering student engagement and relationship building

### Residence Managers

- Full-time supervisors of the Residence Fellows
- Act as an additional support for students and promote a positive community living environment
- On a 24/7 rotating on-call schedule for support and emergency response



## The Residence Life Staff

### Community Managers

- Support and engage students in the Residence-wide community
- Facilitate and support the organization and implementation of Residence-wide initiatives and events, including overseeing the Raven's Roost
- On a 24/7 rotating on-call for student support and emergencies



# **Additional Supports**

### Residence Counselling

- Confidential counselling for all Residence students
- The office and our wellness space are located in Renfrew House

#### Attendant Services

- 24/7 program for students with special needs
- Promotes an independent lifestyle by providing personal support

Implementing environmental and sustainable initiatives in Residence


#### **Residence Serves:**
