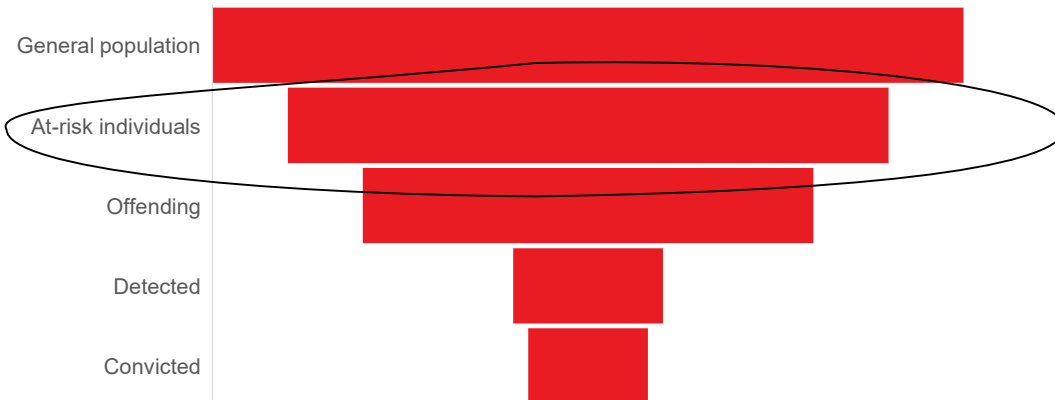

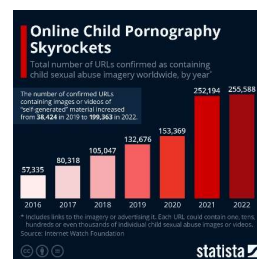

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Lawless Space Theory (Steel et al., 2023)

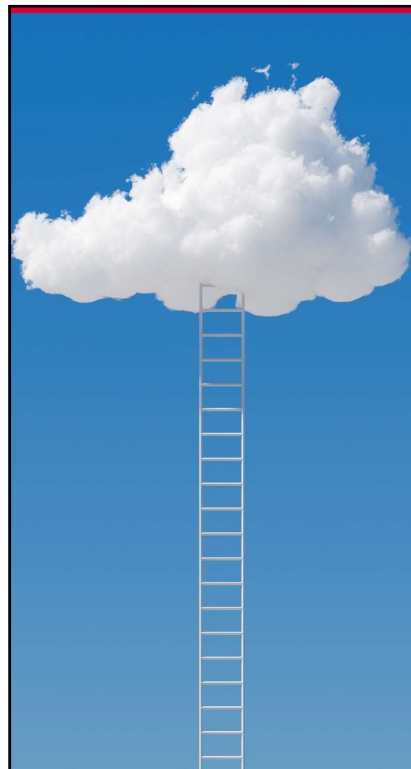
- Offenders are most likely to select and stay in online environments that:
 - **Best meet psychosocial and criminogenic needs**, while requiring minimal effort
 - **Support habituation and differential association**, reducing perceived risk
 - **Normalize deviant behavior**, increasing comfort and
 - **Allow countermeasures** unless they undermine usability
- A Lawless Space Theory (LST) **scale** should evaluate:
 - views of the Internet as being a separate and distinct ecological niche from the physical world
 - having lower capable guardianship, and
 - being a location where criminality occurs and is tolerated.

 - Individuals **convicted of CSAM offenses** will report **lower** LST scores compared to
 - individuals from the general population and
 - professionals with expertise in darknet investigations.



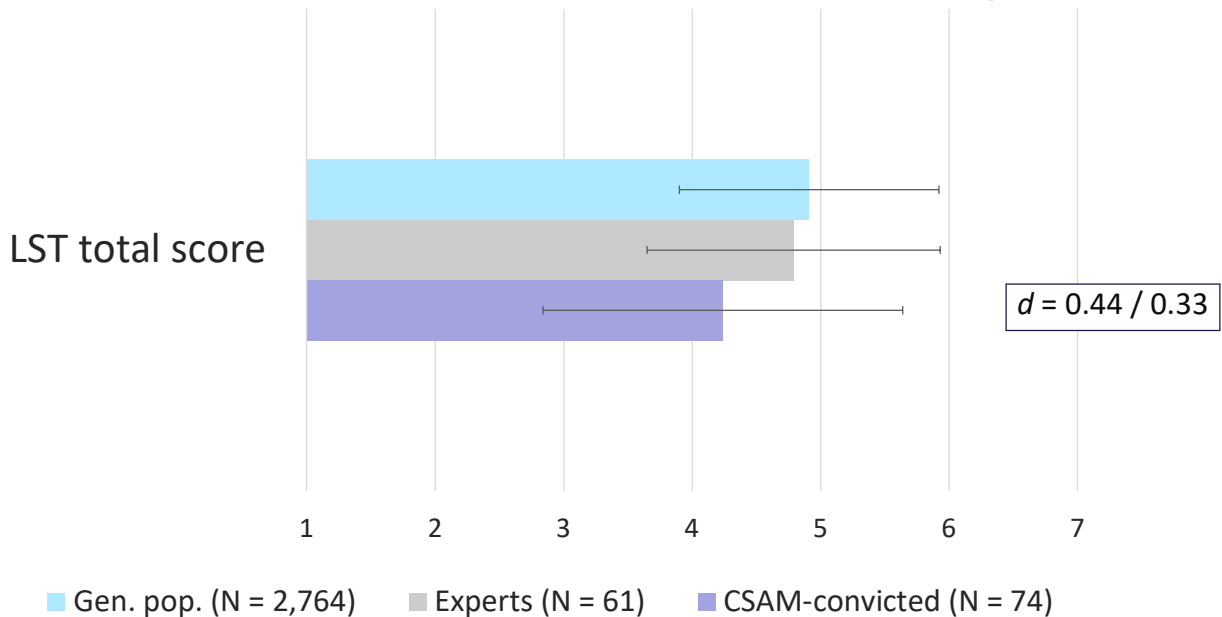

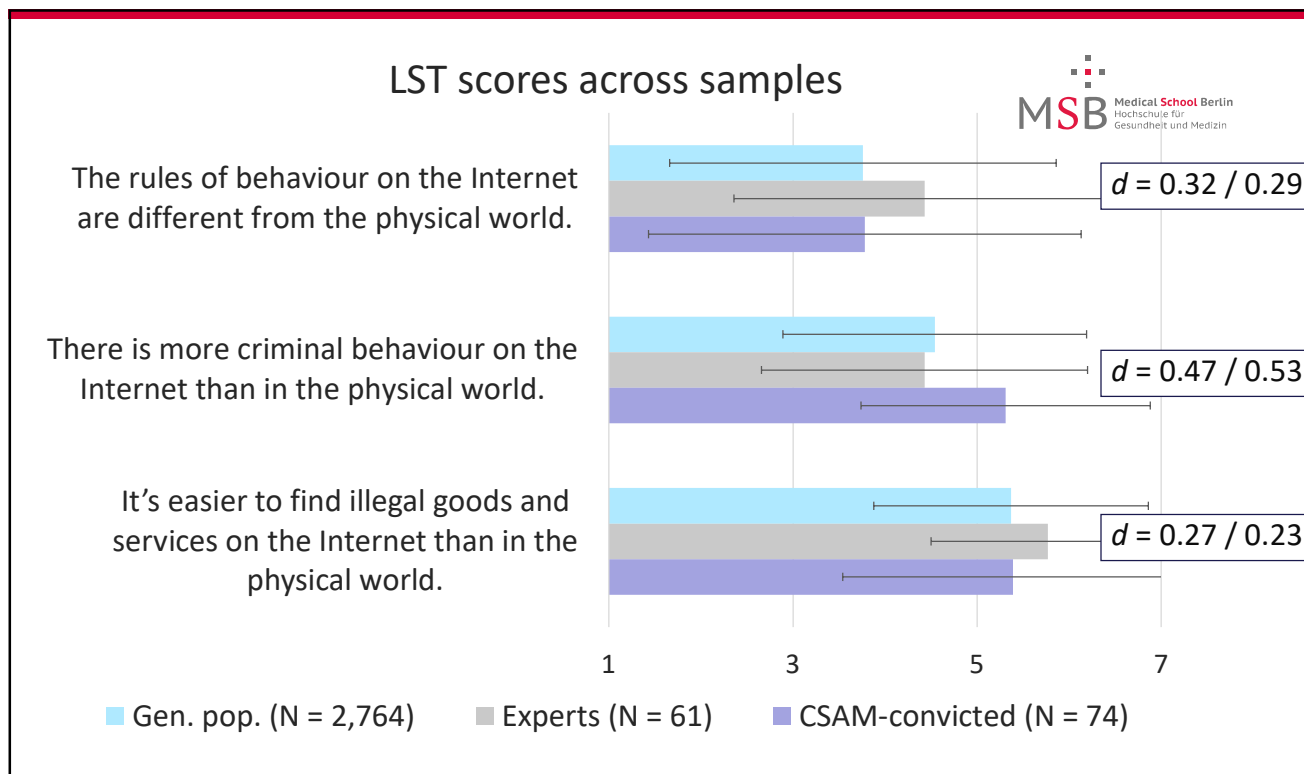

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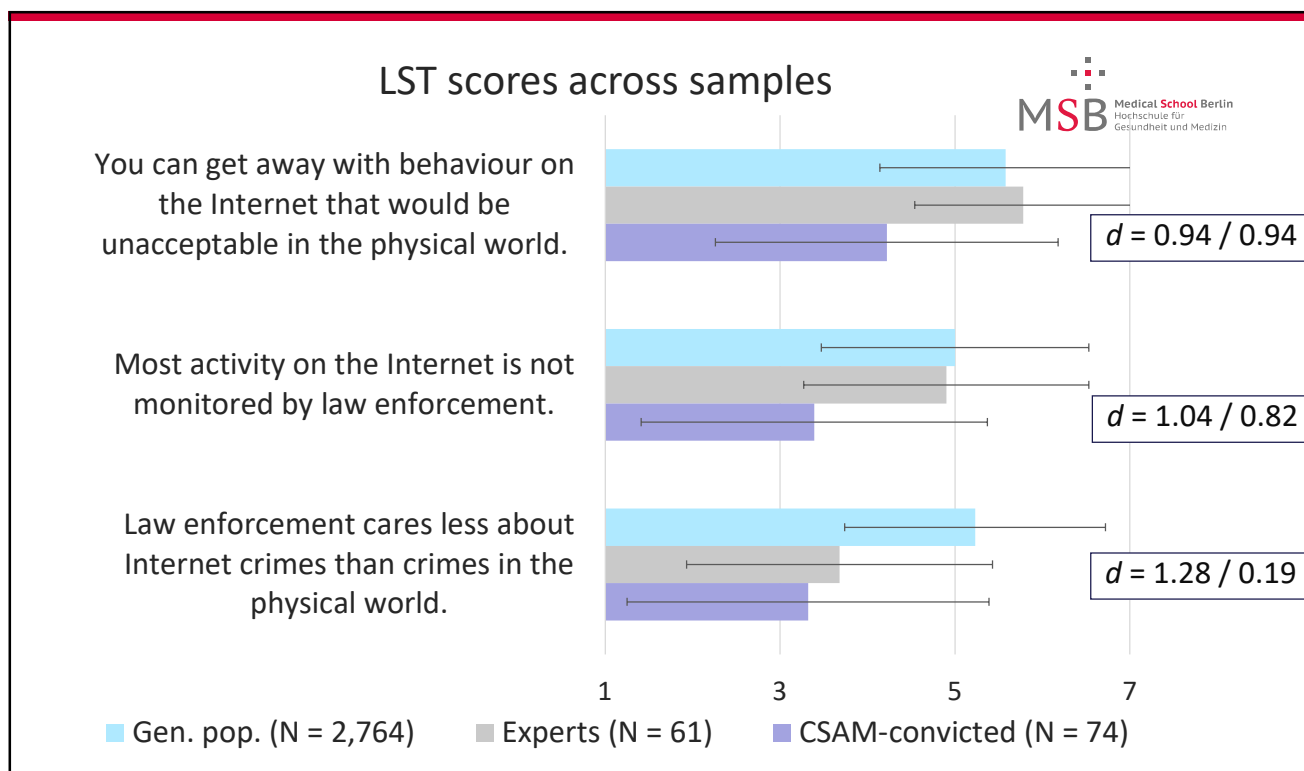
LST scores across samples



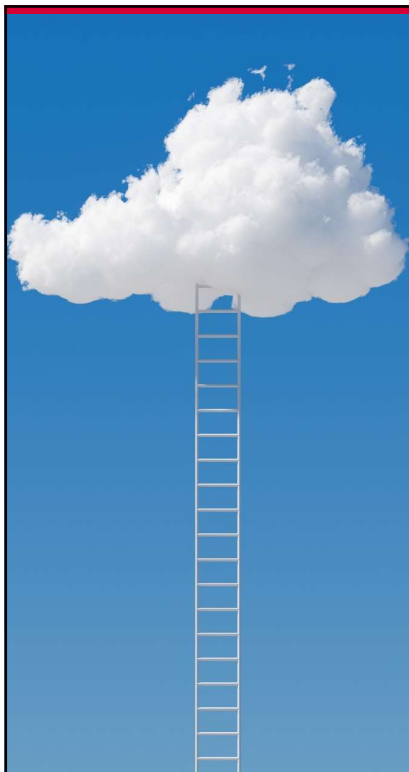

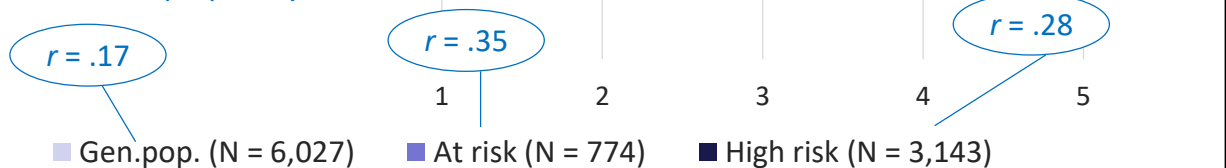

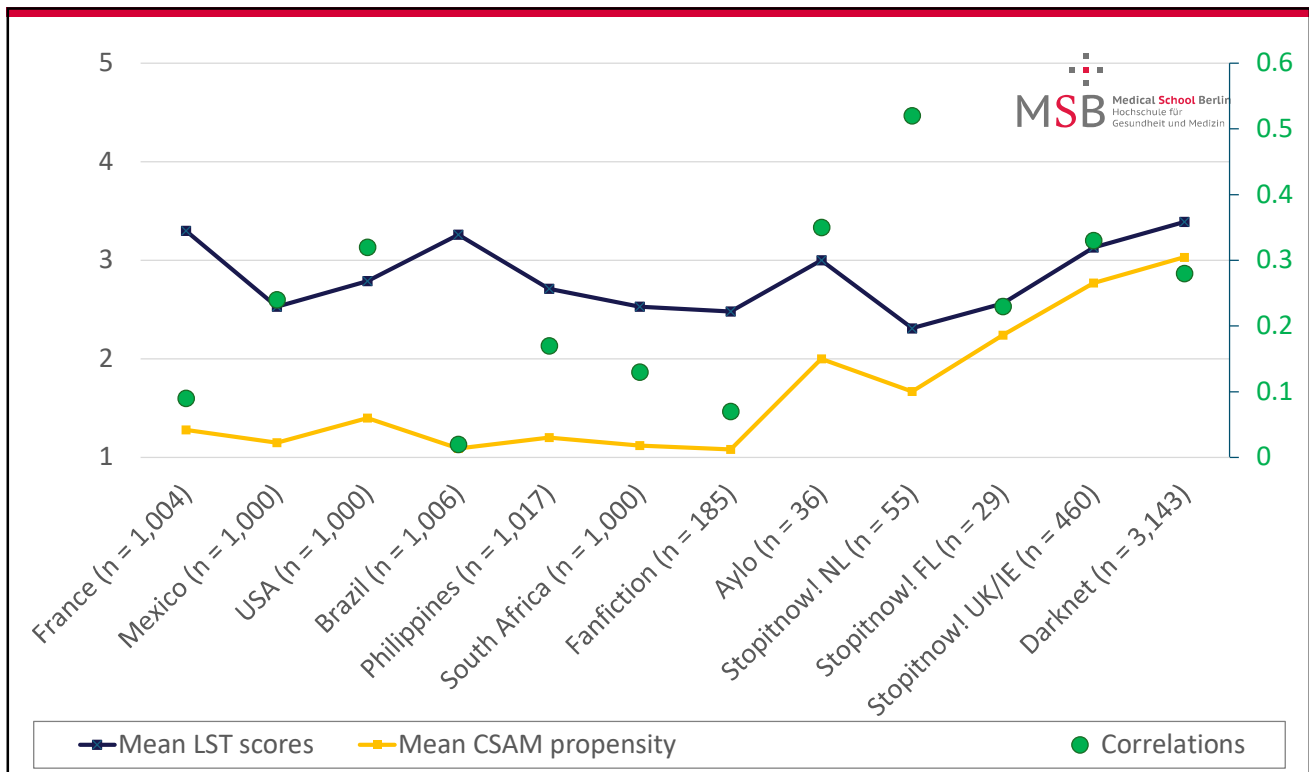

Key Points

- The Internet is widely seen as a **lawless space**
- **Exception:** Convicted online offenders – after being caught, tend to see it as **lawful / monitored**
- At-risk individuals are still within **reach for prevention**
- **Future work:** Explore drivers of LST score variation and links to offending
- **Prevention** should highlight that detection is **possible and likely** (use real examples)

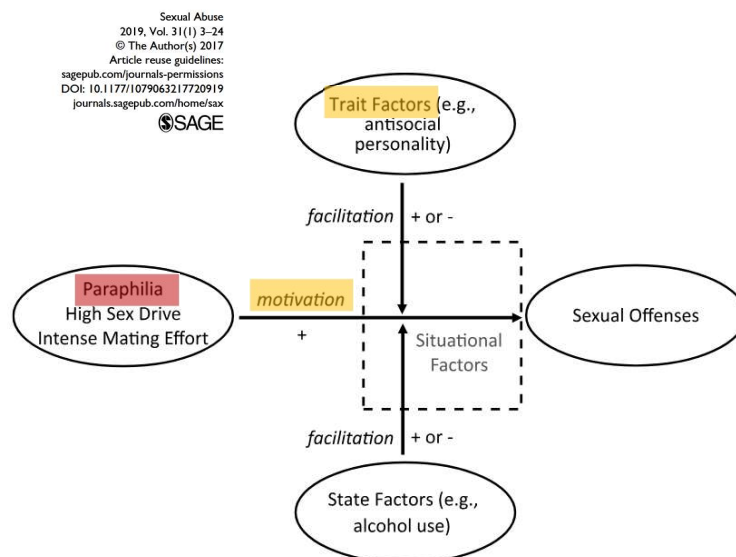

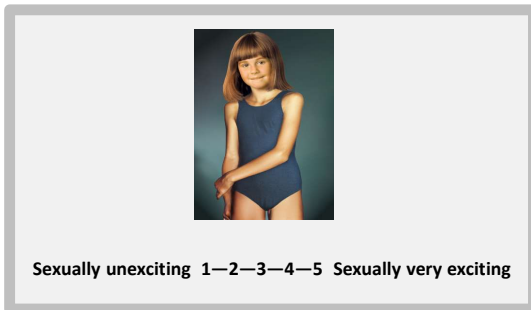

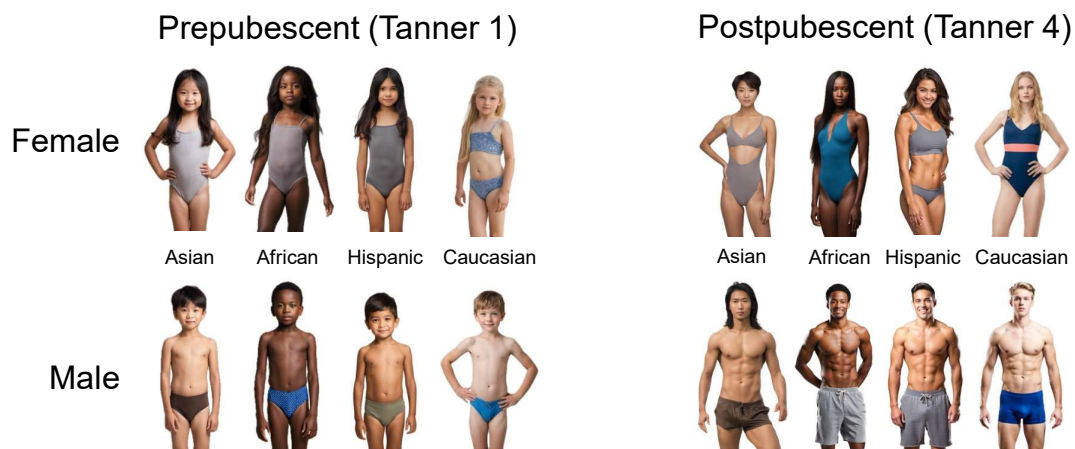
- **Direct measure:** Rating
- **Indirect measure:** Rating latency
- **Validity:** Child Sexual Abusers vs. Controls $d \approx 1.00$ (Children – Adults Difference Indexes)
- Easy to apply and robust indirect measure

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RAPPID VT Picture Set (Brief Version)



- AI-generated non-existing persons
- Designed to (better) represent ethnically diverse sexual interests than standard stimulus sets



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Research Questions

In a high-risk sample of Darknet child sexual abuse material (CSAM) forum members,

- does a newly designed, ethnically more diverse, and brief VT measure produce meaningful results?
 - High level of pedophilic preferences
 - Associations with child sexual abuse propensities and behaviors
- are we able to identify further risk factors that are incrementally valid above pedophilic preferences?
 - As shown in multivariate regression analyses with self-reported child sexual abuse behaviors as criterion

Sample

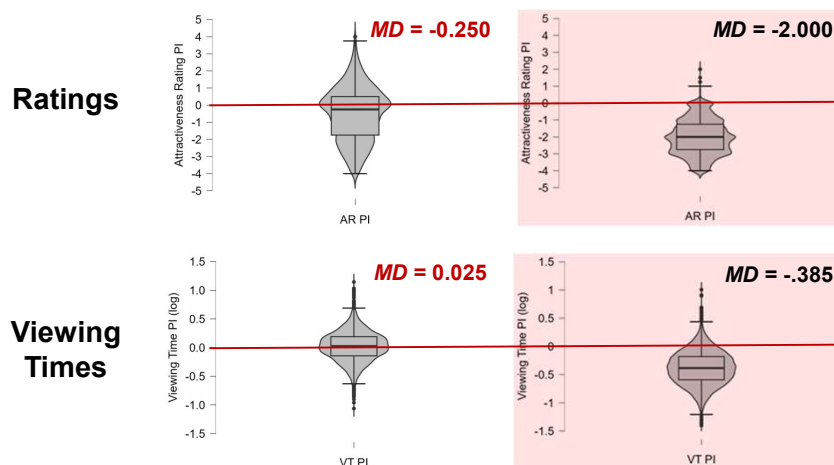
- Recruitment via online survey with link posted in Darknet CSAM forum (with consent from moderators)
- Total survey response: $N = 4,454$
- Honesty, attention, consistency checks passed: **$N = 3,143$** (70.5%)
- **Sex:** Male 90.3%, Female 5.1%, Intersex 0.7%, Prefer not to say 3.9%
- **Age:** $M = 28.6$ years ($SD = 9.6$, min = 18, max = 99)

Sexual Interest Scoring

- **Caveat:** VT raw latencies are categorical due to technical reasons (survey software needed to be compatible with TOR-browser access → measured in 1-second intervals)
- Raw Latencies > 10s truncated and log-transformed
- Aggregation: 2 (Target Sex) x 2 (Target Sexual Maturity), all α s $\geq .77$
- **VT Pedophilic Difference Index** = max. child - max. adult, $\alpha = .15$
- Attractiveness ratings (AR) follow the same rationale based on raw data
- All single category α s $\geq .87$
- AR Pedophilic Difference Index $\alpha = .92$

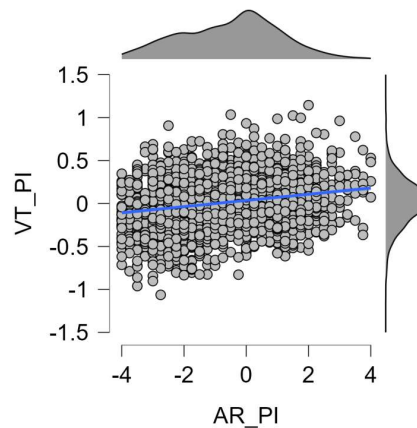

- Extremely high levels of pedophilic preferences (PI > 0) especially for VTs (>50%)

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Validity – Intercorrelations



- Both measures show convergent validity ($r = .213, p < .001$)

- Low social desirability in Darknet CSAM forum users
→ High base rates and propensities
- Self-report AR outperform VT in anonymous research context

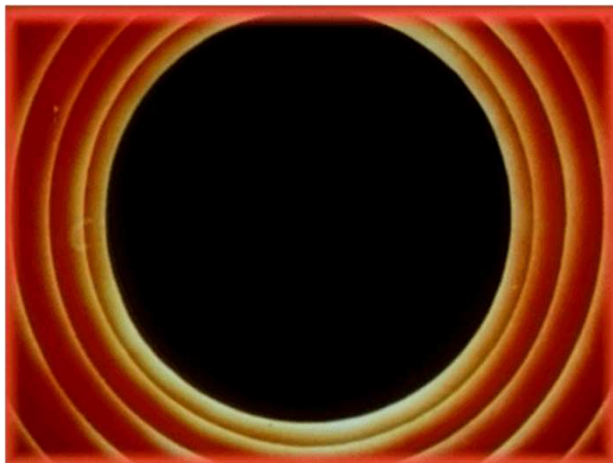

Conclusions

- Preliminary evidence for **validity of newly developed and ethnically diverse VT stimulus set** → note that brief set-up is based on stimulus exemplars only hence an aggregated score is recommended → likely reason for low reliability of difference score
- Extensive surveying of Darknet CSAM forum users is possible
- Indeed **a high-risk population** as indicated by high 1) base rates for CSAM use, 2) child sexual abuse propensities, and 3) prevalences of pedophilic preferences
- Multiple incrementally valid risk factors for child sexual abuse call for **targeted prevention measures addressing individual (sets of) risk factors** above and beyond pedophilic interest
- **Limitation:** Single item/extensively shortened measures allow only rough construct estimators

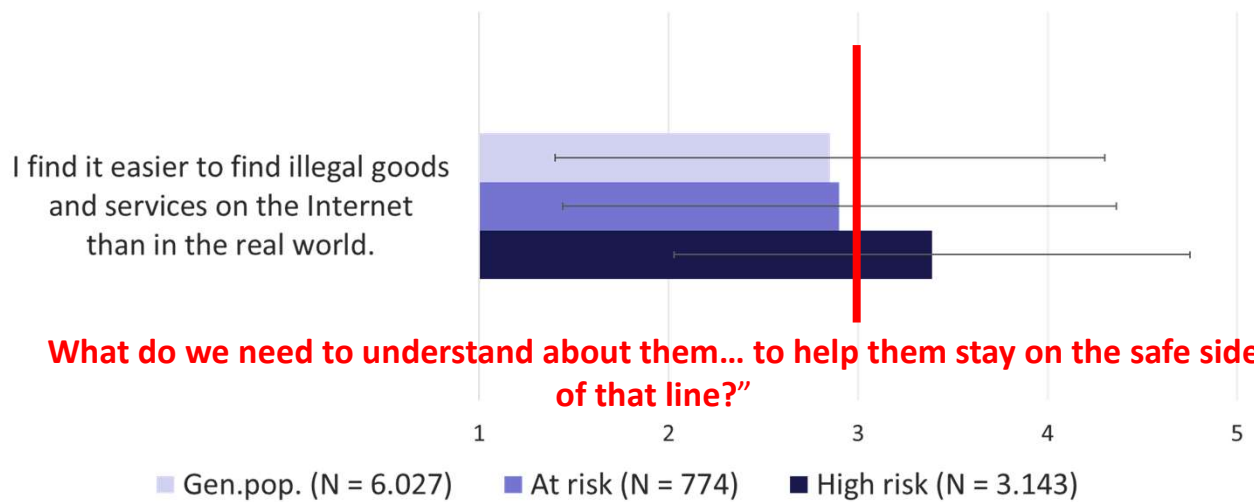

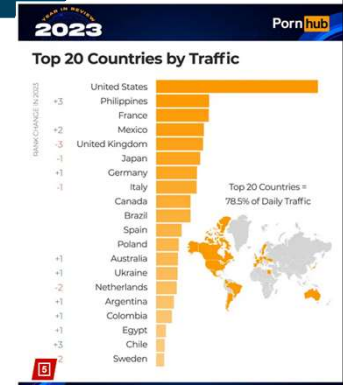

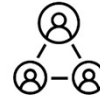

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Variable-Centered Approach: Efficient Model Reduction

Goal: Identify a leaner predictor set **without reducing explanatory power**

→ Stepwise linear regression ($N = 7,859$, 35 candidates)

Approach

Method: Stepwise selection (p-value based)

Criterion: CSEAM tendency (“What would you do if...?”)

Validation: 1,000 bootstrap samples (95% CI)

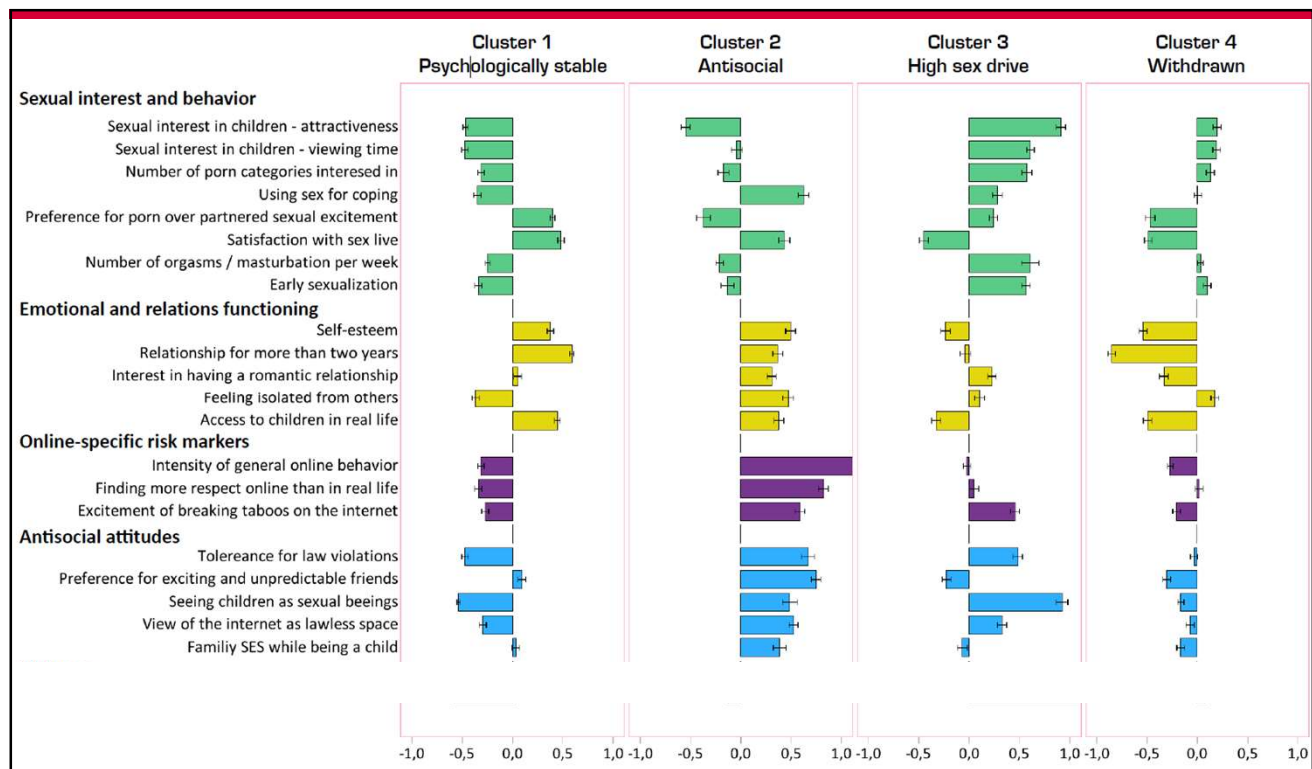
Key Results

- 21 predictors retained

- $R^2 = .64$

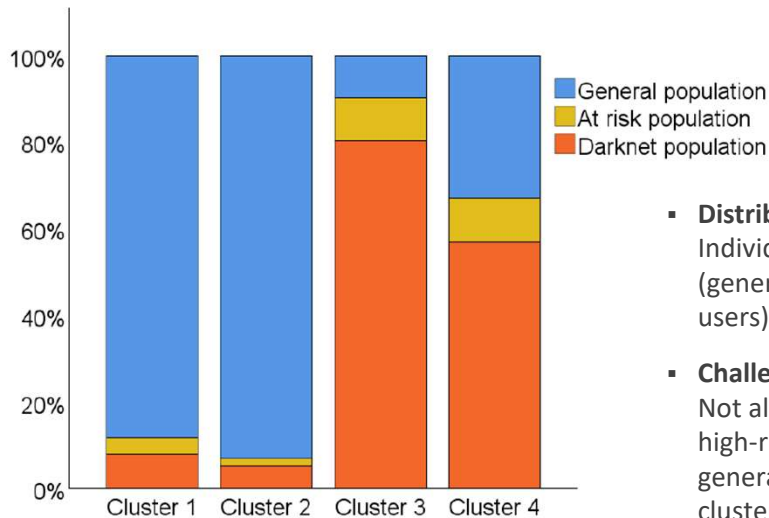
The model holds up in data split—**robust predictors, high explained variance, and consistent results across splits.**

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Risk Profiles Span All Groups



- **Distribution across all clusters:** Individuals from all three groups (general population, at-risk, darknet users) appear in all four clusters.
- **Challenging common assumptions:** Not all darknet users fall into the high-risk cluster, and not all from the general population are in the low-risk cluster.

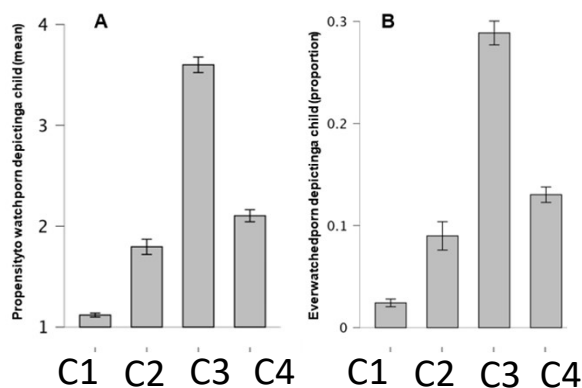

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Propensity for CSAM Use Varies by Cluster and Sample



- **Risk takes multiple forms:** Elevated CSAM use occurs not only in Cluster 3, but also in Clusters 2 and 4, pointing to different psychological risk pathways.
- **Cluster 3 stands out,** but Clusters 2 and 4 also show notable engagement.
- **Different psychological pathways** may lead to risky CSEAM-related behavior.

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Conclusion

- People with a proclivity for CSAM offending are a **heterogeneous group**
- Risk is **not limited** to those with strong sexual interest in children.
- Profiles show additional **withdrawn, or antisocial traits** clusters
- **Different psychological pathways** can lead to similar online behavior.

→ we need targeted deterrence messages!



What is next...

1

Identify *risk factors* for *transitioning from legal to illegal materials* to enable technology industry to prevent and deter online sexual offences

- survey *globally representative samples* and at-risk users (*bottom-up approach*)

2

Translate findings from Study 1 into practical, easy to implement method at *reducing online sexual offences*

- test targeted deterrence messages based on the user profile (*top-down approach*)

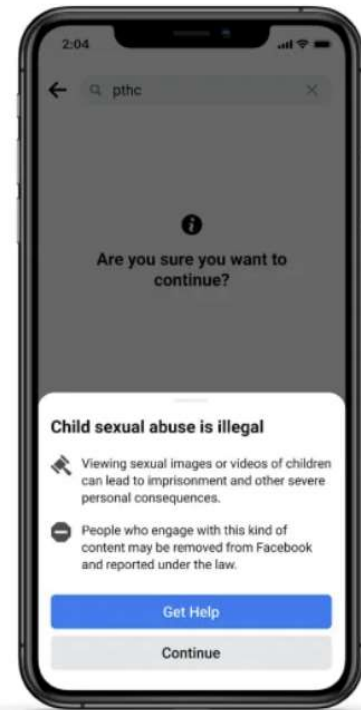

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Get Help messages are increasingly embedded in warning and deterrence messages



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Despite the increasing visibility of help, only a fraction of people searching for CSAM access help resources

Core Question: Can messages be optimised to push more people to seek help?

- Does framing the message on negative outcomes risk a short-term deterrent effect?
 - *Not here*
 - *Not today*
- Are the messages optimised for help seeking?
 - *Not ever*

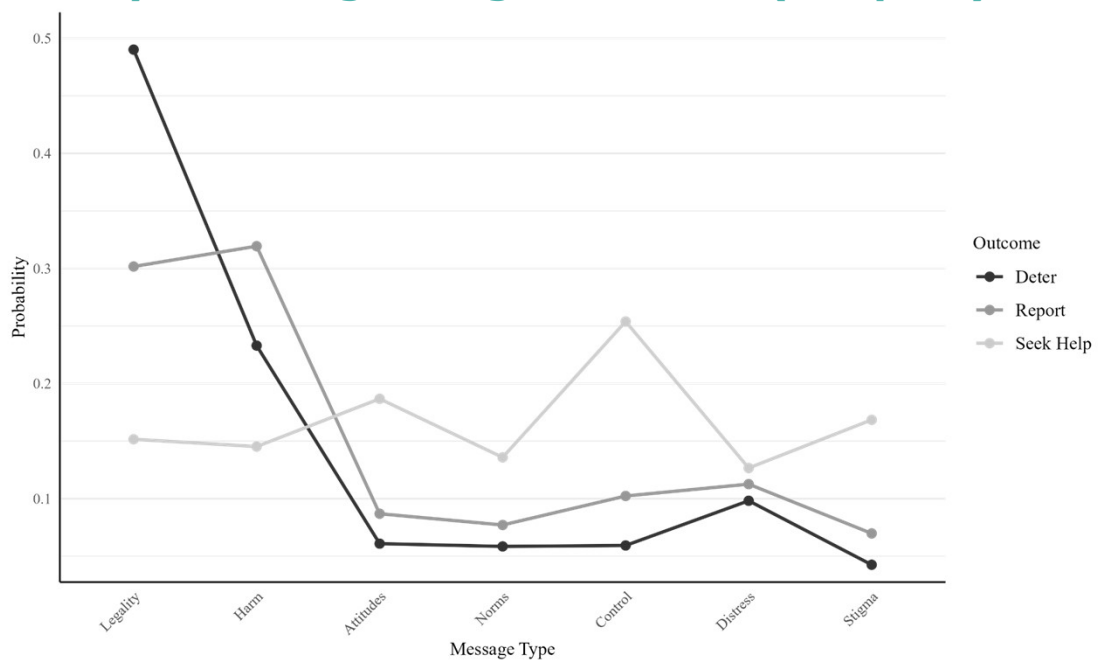
Analysis method

Plackett–Luce Modelling (Plackett, 1975; Finch, 2022)

- Used for analysing ranked data
- Estimates the relative “worth” of each option
- Considers the full ranking, not only first choice

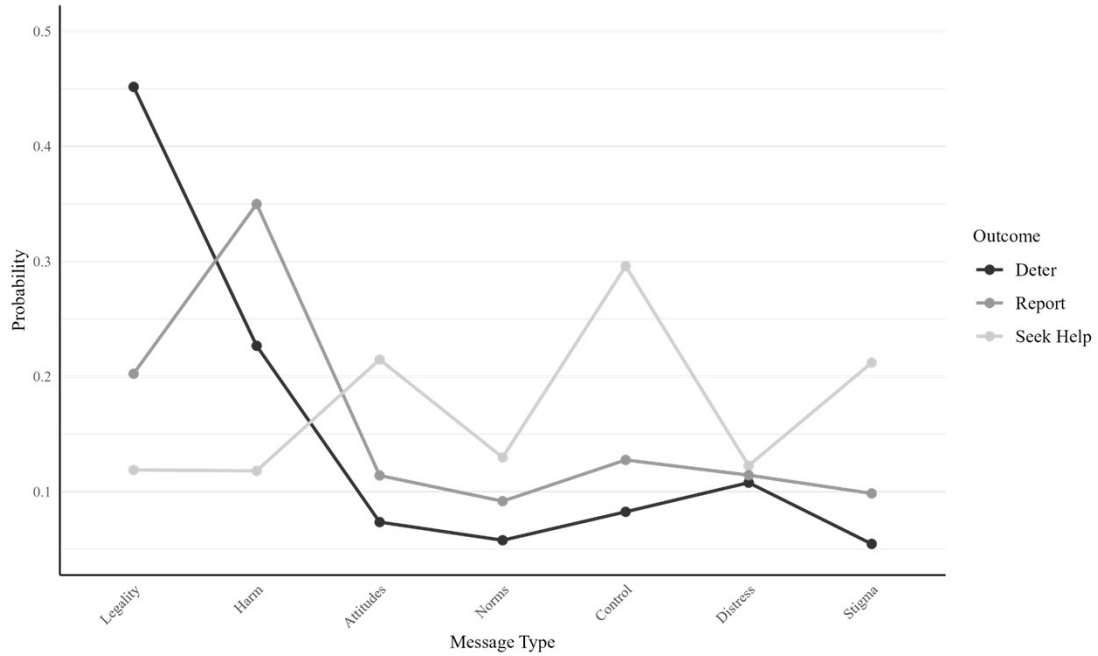

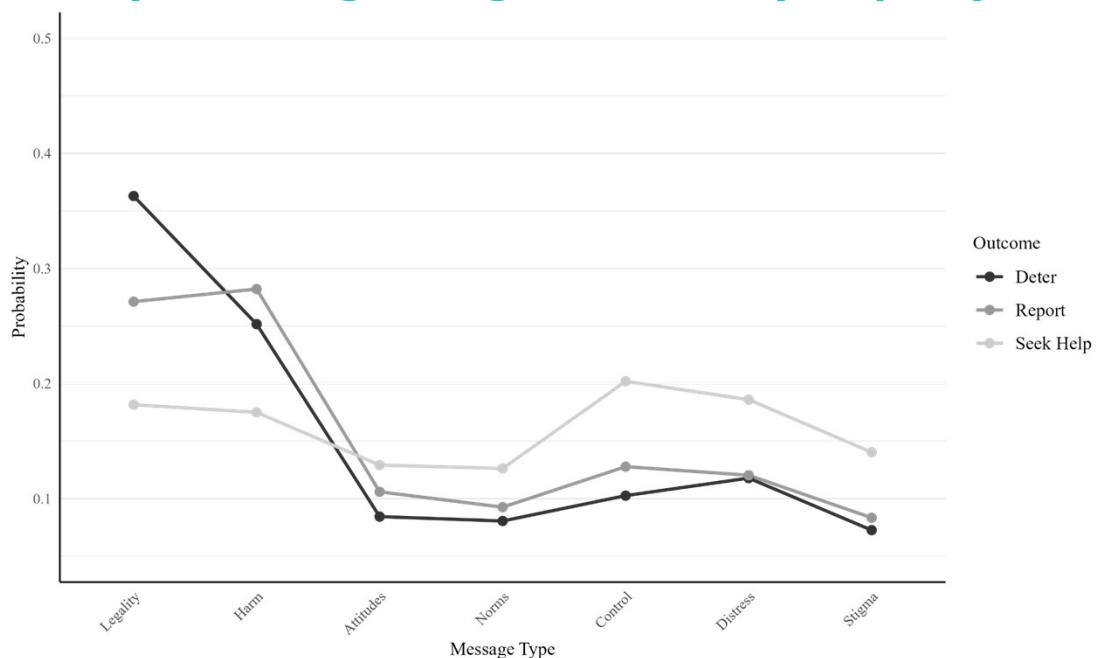

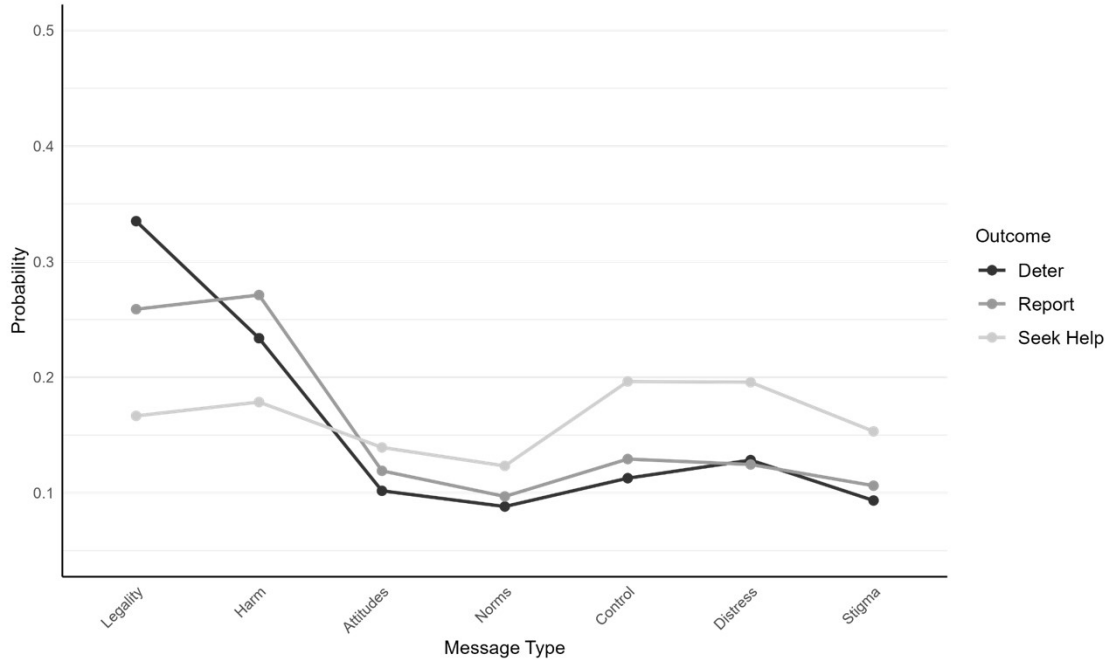

Conclusions

- Different messages are perceived differently
- Optimised messages for help seeking are likely to be those that are framed around positive outcomes
 - Avoiding legal consequences
 - Reducing distress
 - Increasing control
- Note: we observed some country-level differences

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Impact



Caution
