Winter Term

CDNS 1002 [0.5 credit]

Themes in the Study of Canada

This course is scheduled for Monday 1135 – 1325 and has groups.

The University may require that all or part of this course be delivered remotely, including online.

CDNS 3600 [0.5 credit]

Cultural Politics and Identities in Canada

This course is scheduled for Monday 1135 -1425.

The University may require that all or part of this course be delivered remotely, including online.

CDNS 4300 [0.5 credit]

Contested Spaces and Communities

This course is scheduled for Thursday 1435 – 1725.

The University may require that all or part of this course be delivered remotely, including online.

CDNS 4500 [0.5 credit]

Canada and the World

This course is scheduled for Tuesday 1135 – 1425.

The University may require that all or part of this course be delivered remotely, including online.

INDG 1011 [0.5 credit]

Introduction to Indigenous-Settler Encounters

This course is being offered as Online Asynchronous.

Candidates must have academic expertise in the specific areas and topics covered by the courses they are applying to teach. Previous teaching experience in the subject area is an asset for the courses listed above. Doctoral students must be post-comps to be considered. Review of applications and hiring decisions will be made in accordance with the [CUPE 4600 \(Unit 2\) Collective Agreement](#).

Please note that the review of applications will commence no earlier than 21 calendar days after the date posted and continue until the position is filled. *All positions are subject to budgetary approval.*

SICS reserves the right to cancel any courses for which there is insufficient registration.

For positions in **Indigenous Studies, the required minimum qualifications are a graduate degree in Indigenous Studies or a related field. Given the nature of our programs, candidates are also required to have familiarity with Indigenous pedagogical approaches and a record of collaboration with Indigenous communities and organizations.*

A note to all applicants: As per Articles 16.3 and 16.4 in the CUPE 4600 (Unit 2) Collective Agreement, the posted vacancies listed above are first offered to applicants meeting the incumbency criterion.
