Pursuant to Article 16 of the CUPE 4600 Unit 2 Collective Agreement, applications are invited from members of the CUPE 4600 (Unit 2) bargaining unit and other interested persons to teach the following course in the School of Indigenous and Canadian Studies:

INDG 1011* [0.5 credit]: Introduction to Indigenous-Settler Encounters

An interdisciplinary examination of the history of relations between different Indigenous peoples and settler populations from first meetings to the mid-20th century. This course meets **May/June** on **Wednesday & Friday 1030-1230** with the groups meeting on **Wednesday & Thursday**.

The University may require that all or part of this course be delivered remotely, including online.

Previous teaching experience in the subject area is an asset for the course listed above. Doctoral students must be post-comps to be considered. Review of applications and hiring decisions will be made in accordance with the CUPE 4600 (Unit 2) Collective Agreement. Please note that the review of applications will commence no earlier than 21 calendar days after the date posted and continue until the position is filled. All positions are subject to budgetary approval.

*For positions in **Indigenous Studies**, the required minimum qualifications are a graduate degree in Indigenous Studies or a related field. Given the nature of our programs, preference is given to Indigenous candidates, are required to have familiarity with Indigenous pedagogical approaches and have a record of collaboration with Indigenous communities and organizations.
