COURSE DESCRIPTION / INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

What do we mean by Indigenous feminisms, intersectional readings, and settler colonial theory? What is settler colonialism and how do we apply an Indigenous feminist lens to its study? Why analyze popular culture or cultural production more generally?
