Special Topic in Applied Linguistics and Discourse Studies

Topic: Theories of Cross-cultural Communication

This course explores the theoretical underpinnings for the description and analysis of cross-cultural communication (CCC) in oral, written and multimodal interaction. Theories are primarily drawn from sociolinguistics, psycholinguistics and critical discourse analysis, with an emphasis on interdisciplinary frameworks. Specifically, the seminar considers how interpersonal, academic and workplace contexts, in conjunction with basic principles of CCC, have influenced the understanding of the field. Students will be able to work on case studies and seminar topics relevant to their own interests.
