Required Qualifications:

For positions in **Linguistics** and **Applied Linguistics and Discourse Studies**, the required minimum qualifications are a PhD in an appropriate field (usually Linguistics and Applied Linguistics and/or Discourse Studies, respectively) and some successful university teaching experience related to the appropriate field. A desired qualification is experience in course development, including assessment tools.

ALDS 4801 Major Structures of English (0.5 credit)

This course is intended to familiarize students with the structure of the English language, highlighting important contrasts between English and other languages as well as grammatical difficulties for ESL learners. Lectures three hours a week.
