This course is an introduction to the field of ethnomusicology that studies music *as* culture. We follow developments in the outlooks of ethnomusicology's intellectual history and the discipline's core ideas and methodologies through a reading of key texts on topics including: early comparative approaches to the study of music; sound studies; musical anthropology; and recent movements to decolonize the field.
