## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course engages several aspects of Indigenous kinships, relationalities and knowledges. Drawing on Indigenous Studies, Environmental Studies, Anthropology, and History we will explore conceptions of kinships, Indigenous ways of knowing, storytelling, and relationality. It centers Indigenous worldviews and ways of being and doing. We examine how these worldviews shape social interactions between Indigenous and non-Indigenous societies. Topics covered include Indigenous cosmologies, knowledges, water, land, and re-framing human and nonhuman relationships.
