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COURSE DESCRIPTION

In the Fall 2024 term, we will introduce foundations of both research and theory in the field of Education with a focus on the Canadian context. Students will explore present-day debates and issues in education in Canada through textbook readings, lectures, and an independent research project that will conclude with a poster presentation. There will be a significant active learning component that will include weekly in-class exercises where students will have the opportunity to work collaboratively to examine key issues in curriculum, culture, socialization, and current trends in education. Students are expected to bring a critical and self-reflective attitude to all course work.
