Responsible and Impact Investing

This seminar examines both the supply and demand side of social impact investing and responsible investing. This includes analyses of financial instruments, intermediaries, organizational and ethical implications and measurement aspects of program-related and other investments that lever economic, social and environmental value by organizations in or straddling the nonprofit and for-profit sectors.

Case studies, simulations, role playing and other pedagogy suitable to adult learners is an important component of the course. Professional experience with impact investing as it relates to the nonprofit, charitable and philanthropic sector is a valuable asset.

The students are a diverse mix of experienced and aspiring professionals enrolled in the Master or Diploma of Philanthropy and Nonprofit Leadership, the only degree of its kind in Canada.

The instructor must be able to teach in an interactive, online format using the Carleton University system or in a hybrid format of in-class with video participation by some students.
