In 2009 I was also awarded the faculty of Public Affairs teaching award and in 2010 received the university teaching award. I have also been instrumental in promoting and institutionalizing PhD students within the department's research activities and have co-authored 9 papers with PhD and MPA students with 3 more currently in progress. As the manager of several funded research projects I have also been responsible for training and development over 30 RA students.
