- <u>Learning space orientations</u>: Request an orientation to help familiarize yourself with the classroom you will be teaching in.
- <u>HyFlex support</u>: If you've chosen to teach in a HyFlex classroom, review the resources and support available to help you get started with this modality.
- <u>Equipment loans</u>: Request a tablet computer, document camera, lapel mic stem or other equipment to help you and your teaching assistant develop and teach courses.
- Media Commons: Enhance your course with diverse media learning materials, produce a media assignment, such as an audio podcast or a video, or book for your other media creation needs.
- <u>Video recording and hosting</u>: Use Kaltura a cloud-based video management system – for recording, storing, publishing, and streaming videos, video collections, and other media.
- Learning Modules: Incorporate pre-built resources into your courses, such as the <u>Collaborative Indigenous Learning Bundles</u>, which help students better understand Indigenous perspectives, history and politics in Canada, and the <u>FUSION modules</u>, which promote academic skills development, student engagement and career readiness.

## **Brightspace Winter Pre-Term Checklist**

Are you ready to teach your winter D2L Brightspace course? We've prepared a pre-term checklist to help you get everything set up, as well as a list of recent updates to the learning management system to help you stay on top of the latest features and their impact to you.

#### Preterm checklist

- <u>Consult the course setup guide</u> to ensure you include all the important course elements.
- Merge your courses prior to adding content if you're teaching multiple sections of the same course.
- <u>Create a course overview tour</u> to help your students navigate your Brightspace course.
- Activate your course to allow students access as courses are hidden by default when they are created.
- <u>Update Zoom to the latest version</u> to ensure you have access to the newest features, fixes and settings.

# Blog: Student Technology Assistants - A Story from TLS' Past

As indicated in the <u>November 2022</u> TLS newsletter, TLS is celebrating its <u>30th anniversary</u>. To help recognize this milestone, we thought we'd share stories of teaching and learning from our past.

This is our second story in the series. Catch up on the previous story, Early Innovation, <u>here</u>.

The opening of the <u>Future Learning Lab</u> on the 4th floor of the MacOdrum Library marks the return of Carleton's teaching and learning centre to the Library. In 1992 the Teaching and Learning Resource Centre (TLRC) opened on the 5th floor of the Library in two

small spaces, a couple of offices, and a computer lab. This story relates to the Student Technology Assistant (STA) program which was led out of the 5th-floor TLRC offices. The STA program was designed to build partnerships between instructors and students, centred on supporting technology and teaching. The student staff members would handle the technical aspects of early teaching technologies, allowing instructors to focus on their teaching with the tool.
