Over 2023, we opened two innovative spaces at Carleton, the Future Learning Lab and, more recently, the Experiential Learning Hub (ELH). These spaces allow instructors and students to engage with the latest in Virtual and Augmented Reality and immersive learning experiences. Instructors have already begun to use these technologies and spaces in their projects and courses in exciting ways thanks to contributions like the Future Learning Innovation Fellowship and CUELF.

Looking to the year ahead, Artificial Intelligence continues to break barriers and gain new ground. By one estimate, at least 50% of Canadians will be using Al on the job in the next three years. Without a doubt, Al is shaping the way we learn and work, necessitating a rethink to how we structure our classrooms and curricula.

With that in mind, the TLS team continues to provide instructors with information and resources to help meet the challenge of Al head-on. The faculty-led Spotlight on Al series also continues this year. The series features speakers from across Carleton's teaching community talking about the innovative ways that they are responding to the challenges posed by Al. I would also like to take this opportunity to officially welcome Dr. Hashmat U. Khan to his new role as Associate Vice-President (Academic Programs and Strategic Initiatives), succeeding Dwight Deugo. Want to help your students grow their resilience? Start with their adaptability skills.



When you are resilient, you can consistently withstand or recover quickly from unexpected challenges. How? By using your adaptability skills. Adaptability is the ability to respond to change — whether it is expected or unexpected — by planning, persisting, and overcoming setbacks. Although sometimes conceptualized as a personal quality, adaptability is a skill, meaning it can be developed through learning and practice.

The <u>FUSION skill development program</u> helps students gain skills in seven key domains, essential to 21st-century success — adaptability, collaboration, communication, inclusivity, metacognition, problem solving and self-management. You can explore these ready-to-use modules by self-enrolling in the <u>FUSION Facilitator Portal in Brightspace</u>.

Brightspace Winter Pre-Term Checklist

Are you ready to teach your winter D2L Brightspace course? We've prepared a pre-term checklist to help you get everything set up, as well as a list of recent updates to the learning management system to help you stay on top of the latest features and their impact to you.

Preterm checklist:

- Consult the course setup guide to ensure you include all the important course elements.
- Merge your courses before adding content if you're teaching multiple sections of the same course.
- Create a course overview tour to help your students navigate your Brightspace course.
- Activate your course to allow students access as courses are hidden by default when they are created.
- <u>Update Zoom to the latest version</u> to ensure you have access to the newest features, fixes and settings.
