Carleton University Teaching Awards

Are you an innovative educator dedicated to teaching excellence? Or do you know an outstanding educator who deserves recognition? Teaching and Learning Services is currently accepting applications and nominations for several internal awards.

Carleton University Teaching Awards

There are four Carleton University Teaching Awards open for applications and nominations:

- Provost's Fellowship in Teaching Award: recognizes faculty and contract instructors dedicated to sustained excellence in teaching, scholarship of teaching and the continual development of teaching.
- New Faculty Excellence in Teaching Award: recognizes new faculty members who underscore Carleton's commitment to teaching excellence and innovation.
- Excellence in Blended and Online Teaching Award: recognizes faculty members and contract instructors whose teaching in blended, HyFlex and/or online environments has had an exceptional impact on student learning.
- Excellence in Learning Support Award: recognizes the many educational support staff
 members who contribute to the student learning experience through their tireless work
 and support in labs, classrooms and many other diverse learning environments across
 Carleton.

The application deadline is **April 30**.

Carleton University Chair in Teaching Innovation

The <u>Chair in Teaching Innovation</u> is awarded annually to an educator who demonstrates teaching excellence and innovation across their academic career. Each chair appointment is for a three-year period. The successful candidate will receive a \$45,000 grant (allocated

in three annual installments) to undertake projects that advance the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) and student success at Carleton.

Applications are due by May 30. Appointments begin on July 1.



Reminder: Poll Everywhere end of life:

- On May 01, 2024, Poll Everywhere will reach end of life at Carleton University and the enterprise license will no longer be available to Carleton users.
- Wooclap will officially replace Poll Everywhere as Carleton's enterprise student response system beginning May 2024; however, Wooclap is available for use now. Instructors can use Wooclap to create polls, surveys, competitions and other activities for students to engage with using their laptop, phone, or other device.
- If you'd like assistance with migrating from Poll Everywhere to Wooclap, reach out to us. We're here to help make your transition easier.

eCarleton end of life notice:

- On June 30, 2024, eCarleton will reach end of life at Carleton University.
- Teaching and Learning Services will be discontinuing the eCarleton service as part of budgetary constraints and because other systems exist on campus to fulfill this role.
 eCarleton is an externally-facing learning management system (LMS) based on the Moodle platform (much like cuLearn). Carleton University migrated from Moodle to Brightspace in May of 2021. TLS would like to help eCarleton users migrate to Brightspace for their course needs.

EON XR is available for use in Brightspace!

- <u>EON-XR</u> is a Virtual (VR) and Augmented Reality (AR) platform, integrated into Brightspace, for creating experiences students and instructors can explore on smartphones, laptops, and VR headsets. EON-XR is easy to use and requires no specific coding knowledge.
- Come explore what EON has to offer at the Experiential Learnign Hub! Teaching and Learning Services staff at the ELH are ready to consult with you about using EON-XR in your course or your research.


