Carleton Professor Awarded Canada's Top Post-Secondary Teaching Award

<u>Kahente Horn-Miller</u>, associate professor in Carleton University's <u>School of Indigenous</u> and <u>Canadian Studies</u>, and inaugural Associate Vice-President, <u>Indigenous Teaching</u>, <u>Learning</u>, and <u>Research</u>, is a recipient of a 2023 3M National Teaching Fellowship.

The 3M National Teaching Fellowship is Canada's most prestigious recognition of excellence in post-secondary teaching and educational leadership. The community of 3M National Teaching Fellows embodies the highest ideals of teaching excellence and scholarship with a commitment to encourage and support the educational experience of every learner. Up to 10 fellowships are awarded annually.

Funded by Teaching and Learning Services (TLS) and the faculty supervisor, the I-CUREUS program provides an opportunity for undergraduate students to conduct paid research, access research scholarships and gain hands-on experience in their discipline or an area of interest.

Internships span from May to August 2023 for a maximum of 150 hours.

- Zoom update required: As of April 29, Carleton Zoom users will be required to update their Zoom desktop client and mobile apps to the latest version. 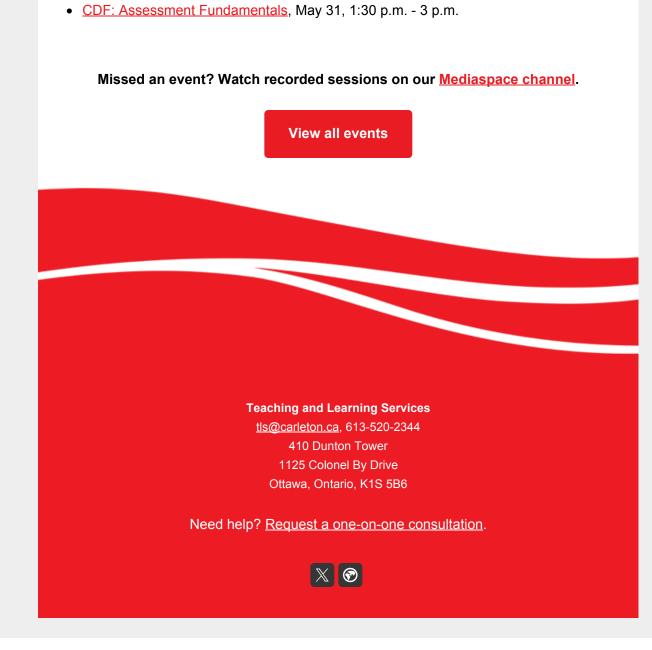
