David Hornsby Appointed Vice-Provost and Associate Vice-President (Academic)

Carleton University President Benoit-Antoine Bacon and Provost and Vice-President (Academic) Jerry Tomberlin have announced David Hornsby's appointment as Vice-Provost and Associate Vice-President (Academic) for a five-year term effective July 1,

2023. The role of Vice-Provost and Associate Vice-President (Academic) will be expanded to include oversight of academic quality assurance, curriculum development, as well as Teaching and Learning Services. This expanded portfolio will increase collaboration among several central functions of Carleton's academic mission.

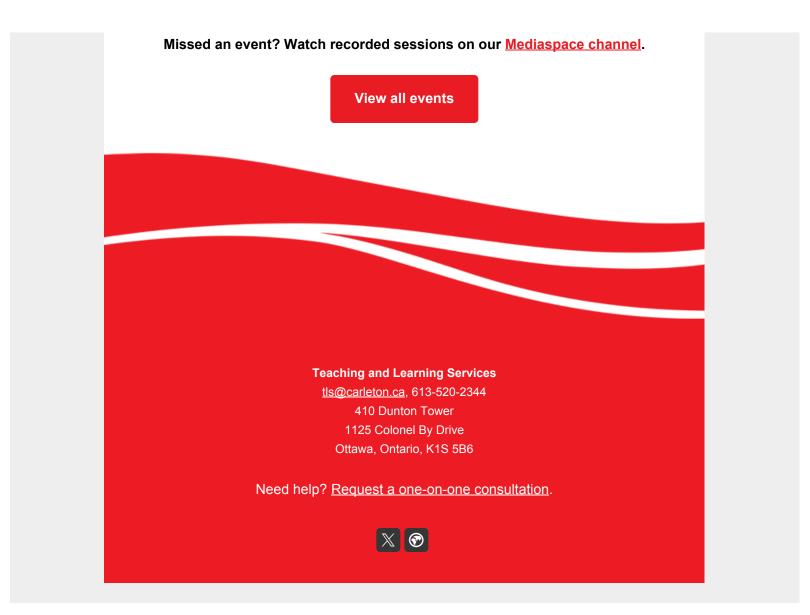
