Enhancing Workforce Skills and Student Mobility at Carleton

Last month we announced new funding that will help propel the advancement of micro-credential programs at Carleton:

- Associate Professor Stefania Maggi was awarded \$49K to develop a [micro-credential on Climate Change and Youth Mental Health](#), as part of the Ontario Micro-credentials Challenge Fund. This initiative uses immersive technology to help students tackle mental health challenges related to climate change, promoting resilience and

proactive coping skills.

- Additionally, Carleton has [received \\$75K from the Ontario Council on Articulation and Transfer \(ONCAT\)](#) to develop a new micro-credentials framework. This project aims to make it easier for students to transfer credits between programs and institutions, offering flexible learning options that enhance job prospects and academic success.

We are grateful for the Ontario government's support in helping Carleton advance its commitment to preparing students for high-demand jobs and making education more accessible through micro-credentials.

Poll Everywhere Polls Transferred to Wooclap

- Carleton has officially transitioned to our newly integrated Student Response System, [Wooclap](#)! Check your email for an invite to collaborate on your Wooclap event, and sign in to [Wooclap with your MyCarletonOne credentials](#) to find your content under the **Shared With Me** folder.
- You might notice that images were not transferred in the content migration, but don't fret! You can still access your basic Poll Everywhere account by requesting to reset the password.

New Features Available in Brightspace Tools

- **Introducing the Peer Feedback Tool:** After running a successful pilot, TLS is excited to announce that we have enabled a new feature in Brightspace: Peer Feedback! This tool allows students to provide each other with feedback on assessments and activities like group work and presentations. For example, Instructors can ask students to rate their peers numerically based on Completed tasks on time: 4/5; Participated in discussions: 3/5; etc. Students can also leave a comment to provide helpful context.
- **Scheduler Tool:** Instructors are now able to create recurring bookable schedules using the Scheduler Tool in Brightspace. This allows students to book a timeslot with their Instructor, and when their timeslot passes, they will be able to book another slot. Instructors can now enable email notifications when their students sign up for or drop a timeslot. How-to videos on the [Brightspace Tools Course](#) are coming soon!

Increasing Brightspace Security

- On August 1, 2024, all instructors and faculty will need to use Microsoft's Azure Multi-

Factor Authentication to log into Brightspace.

- MFA provides an extra layer of security and protection for our users and our data. Currently MFA is being used on many other systems at Carleton.
