Carleton University Instructors Receive Prestigious OCUFA Teaching Award

received the OCUFA award. This time marks the fourth consecutive year that a Carleton educator was named.



Fall I-CUREUS and SaPP Applications Are Now Open

Help provide Carleton students with the opportunity to participate in undergraduate research or to partner on course design. Applications for Teaching and Learning Services' <u>I-CUREUS and Students as Partners Program (SaPP)</u> are now open for the fall term.

<u>I-CUREUS</u>: Provides an opportunity for undergraduate students to conduct paid research and gain hands-on experience in their discipline or area of interest. Internships span from September 2023 to April 2024 for a maximum of 150 hours.

<u>SaPP</u>: Offers instructors and learning support staff the opportunity to involve undergraduate students in teaching innovation and curriculum design through paid work experience. Students can partner on a variety of projects to help you prepare for your upcoming courses. The program runs until the end of the summer term, with students working up to 130 hours.

Apply for the Future Learning Innovation Fellowship by September 15 for the opportunity to receive \$10,000 to support your project. Wellness Widget Comes to Brightspace!

One of the challenges students may face with regard to their well-being is how to access resources or support on



campus. To help, Neuroscience and the Wellness team have co-developed a new 'Wellness widget' for the Brightspace environment that will direct students to the Wellness Navigator. Completing the Wellness Navigator will provide students with tailored resources based on answers related to various indicators such as their symptoms (lonely, sad, depressed), year level, place of residence, gender identity, etc. Any instructor is welcome to import the widget into their course site and help to increase access and awareness of mental health resources on campus.

- BBB has reached end of life in Brightspace: Instructors are encouraged to
 transition to Zoom for their web conferencing needs. If you have copied over old
 course content with BBB links, please ensure the links are removed before the course
 is active. Copied BBB links will result in error messages. Review the BBB to Zoom
 Crosswalk support page or the BBB FAQ Page for more information about
 transitioning to Zoom for teaching and learning.
- Zoom minimum update: On August 29, 2023, all Carleton Zoom users will be
 required to upgrade to the newest version of the Zoom desktop client and mobile app.
 Updates ensure you receive the newest features, as well as any privacy and security
 enhancements. Please log in a few minutes in advance of Zoom meetings to allow
 time for the update. If you haven't already done so, setup <u>automatic updates</u> for the
 Zoom desktop client/app to save you time. Visit the <u>What's New with Zoom</u> page to

Reminders for courses this fall:

Merge your courses prior to adding content: If you're teaching multiple sections of the same course and want to merge them into one in Brightspace, fill out the <u>course</u> merge request form before you've built any course content. Courses can only be merged prior to student activity in the course.

Activate your course to allow students access: Courses are hidden by default when they are created. You'll need to activate your course to share it with your students.
