Enhancing Accessibility in Brightspace

Interested in increasing the accessibility of your Brightspace course page? Submit a <u>Course Consultation</u> request to meet with our team one-on-one. In the meantime, consider the following practices:

Use Accessible Content Formats:

- Ensure all course materials, such as documents, slides, and videos, are in accessible formats. Adding both Microsoft and PDF formats ensures all learners can access the content.
- All learners benefit from captions and transcripts for video and audio content.

Implement Clear and Consistent Navigation:

- Design a clear, consistent, and logical navigation structure. Use headings, subheadings, and consistent layouts to help students easily find and access materials.
- Avoid complex menus and ensure that all links are descriptive and meaningful, helping students using screen readers to understand the context.

Provide Alternative Text and Descriptions:

- Add alternative text (alt text) for all images, graphics, and charts to describe their content for visually impaired students.
- Use descriptive links instead of "click here" or "read more" so that screen readers can provide context about the linked content.

Utilize Accessibility Features and Tools:

- Take advantage of Brightspace's built-in accessibility features, such as the <u>Accessibility Checker</u>, which identifies and suggests fixes for accessibility issues in course content.
- Using Quicklinks in Brightspace reduces your workload when copying content from one course to another because they are relative links!

Ensure Accessible Assessments:

Create accessible quizzes and assignments by using question types and formats that

- can be navigated easily by all students. Avoid relying on timed assessments which can be challenging for neurodivergent learners.
- Offer alternative assessment options, ensuring that all students have equal opportunities to demonstrate their knowledge.

Improving Brightspace Navigability

We've made some exciting updates to the Brightspace NavBar to enhance your teaching experience! *For instructors only*, these new additions have been added to streamline your workflow:

- Classlist and Content Reports: Now under the "Progress" menu, you can easily access your <u>Classlist</u> and <u>detailed content reports</u> to monitor student engagement and progress.
- Rubrics: Located under the "Tools" section, you can quickly find and manage rubrics.

Fall Semester Reminders

- Merge your courses prior to adding content: If you're teaching multiple sections of
 the same course and want to merge them into one in Brightspace, fill out the course
 merge request form before you've built any course content. Courses can only be
 merged prior to student activity in the course.
- Activate your course to allow students access: Courses are hidden by default
 when they are created. You'll need to activate your course to share it with your
 students. The TLS team is ready to consult with you about your fall semester:
 complete the course consultation request form for any course request need. TLS is
 ready to help!


