## Welcome to a new Term



This time last year, we were stepping back onto campus after two and a half years marked by the global pandemic. Though its effects will endure, I am grateful for the energy and vibrancy that has returned to our campus life.

As I take up the role of Vice-Provost, which includes responsibility for Teaching and Learning Services in addition to academic program development and quality assurance, it is critical to keep an eye on what lies ahead.

Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) dominates the headlines, offering a mix of opinions showing deep concern and hopeful optimism. As educators, we already see the impacts of AI on how we teach, work and how our students approach their studies.

But while AI has created challenges and some concerns for educators, it also provides the opportunity to enhance teaching and learning and positively transform education. From assisting in course design and data analysis to providing students with a virtual tutor, today's educators are exploring new and exciting ways to incorporate AI into their teaching.

As we continue to adapt and look for new and exciting opportunities, TLS has put together several resources and guidelines to help instructors navigate Al in the classroom. I invite you to explore them here.

Continuing with technology, this fall, we open the Experiential Learning Hub, our state-of-the-art facility located in Southam Hall that will bring students and instructors together to engage and experiment with Extended Reality (XR) educational technologies.

The Hub includes three new studios to support experiential learning through the use and development of XR media with tools and support provided in part by the <u>Future Skills XR</u> <u>Grant in partnership with EON Reality</u>. I'm thrilled with this new space, which along with the existing <u>Future Learning Lab</u>, fosters innovation and creates additional opportunities for collaboration between instructors and students.

Collaboration is just one of the ways that we are embracing change and transforming higher education, as envisioned by the <u>Future of Teaching and Learning Working Group report</u> released this year. We are also empowering our students with the skills to be successful in the classroom and their future careers through programs like <u>FUSION</u>. I encourage you to check out the modules available and let us know if we can assist in integrating them within your courses.

As you prepare for the first few weeks of classes, remember that Teaching and Learning Services is here to help you imagine possibilities and address challenges in your courses. Reach out for support with pedagogies, assessment strategies or educational strategies.

# Preparing for Fall Term: Resources and Supports for Instructors

• Teaching and Learning Services (TLS) provides comprehensive support for the university's teaching and learning activities, including course design, teaching and assessment strategies, digital learning (online, blended and HyFlex), and learning spaces and technology. We oversee the Future Learning Lab, the Students as Partners Program, I-CUREUS (an undergraduate research initiative), and FUSION (a skills development program). - Collaborative Indigenous Learning Bundles have been designed as both a resource for instructors and a learning tool for students to use in the classroom. The Bundles share necessary factual and theoretical bases for understanding Indigenous history, politics, and related issues in Canada, while also prompting students to consider how this knowledge may be applied in their area of study. In these Bundles, you will learn from Indigenous academics and Knowledge Keepers discussing topics that may relate to your coursework.
- The <u>Centre for Indigenous Support and Community Engagement</u> assists students, staff, and faculty at Carleton by providing culturally safe spaces for dialogue and learning and is available for individual curricular consultations with faculty. The Centre also provides one-off facilitation opportunities and mediation support as well.


### **Support for Your Teaching Assistants This Term**

Are you working with a teaching assistant (TA) this fall? We have several resources to assist you in supporting your TAs, including:

- Training: TA pedagogical training workshops are offered online with the exception of a couple of in-person *TA Basics 101* sessions (check Carleton Central for dates and details). TAs can register for workshops through the <u>Carleton Central—TA</u> <u>Management System</u>.
- TA Central Hub: Training & resources: The TA Central Hub is our Brightspace learning portal for TAs to watch pre-recorded training videos, access resource materials and share resources related to teaching. - TA Basics 101: We encourage all new TAs (undergraduate and graduate) to register and attend one of these sessions. #### Reminder: Audio Amplification in a Classroom

Most of Carleton's classrooms include an instructor wireless microphone and speaker system. We encourage you to use the microphone to ensure that you are heard by all students.


