5 Things to Discover in the ELH

Last month, we officially opened the Experiential Learning Hub (ELH), Carleton's new space that brings instructors and students together to collaborate, exchange ideas and experiment with the latest immersive technologies. In case you missed the opening, here is our list of some of the things to discover in the hub.

Experience VR in the XR Experience

Teach in the Active Learning

Studios: The studios are technologyenhanced spaces designed to facilitate education through headset-based Extended Reality (XR) experiences. Accessible and adaptable, these spaces have everything you need for a fully immersive and educational experience. Classroom: Spacious and flexible, the Active Learning Classroom is designed for group collaboration and participation and allows instructors to connect with students in a non-conventional setting that provides an enriching experience for all. Requests can be made through Scheduling and Exam Services for the winter term.

Scan and Create 3D objects in the Creation Suites: Equipped with 3D scanning workstations and 360° cameras (bookable this winter term), the Creation Suites allow you to digitize objects for use in your AR/VR creations!

Design a VR/AR experience using EON-XR: Explore the power of three-dimensional learning using <u>EON-XR</u>'s easy-to-use tools. Use an existing 3D model from their asset library or work with one of your own 3D objects or 360° pictures you've taken using equipment from the ELH. The possibilities are endless.

Record a podcast in the Creation

Suites: From using podcasts in the study of the French language in Canada to a four-part podcast series as part of a final class project, instructors are finding novel and engaging uses of audio in teaching and learning. Discover the many recording suites equipped with Shure microphones and acoustic panels ready for your next creative project.

 Wooclap Pilot will run from December 01, 2023, to April 30, 2024.
- Explore new features and functionality in Zoom:
 - Taking notes during online classes just got easier with Zoom Notes. This feature
 allows students to jot down important information directly within the Zoom app.
 Notes can be saved and shared for later review, helping students stay organized

- Share a video with participants in the Zoom waiting room: The Waiting Room
 enhancement allows educators to display a custom video or message to students
 while they wait to join the meeting. This personalized touch can set the tone for a
 positive learning experience: Enabling and customizing the Waiting Room.
- Breakout Rooms Based on Poll Results: Use Zoom Polling to automatically assign students to breakout rooms based on their answers to your questions. Automatic assignment based on polls streamlines the process of group work and ensures balanced distribution.
