# **Applications for Winter 2024 SaPP and I-CUREUS Projects Are Now Open**

Help provide Carleton students with the opportunity to participate in undergraduate research or to partner on course design.

The <u>Students as Partners Program (SaPP)</u> connects undergraduate students with instructors, librarians & teaching support staff to involve students in course design projects. SaPP offers students up to 130 hours of paid work over the course of one academic term.

<u>I-CUREUS</u> is a paid research internship for undergraduate students to conduct Faculty-supervised research and gain hands-on experience in their area of interest! Internships can be a maximum of 150 hours and must end before the end of the Winter term.

### **Scantron Processing in December**

Instructors using Scantron during the final exam period (Dec.10 to 22) are asked to drop off their Scantrons sheets to the TLS main office located at 410 Dunton Tower, immediately after concluding their exams. This will facilitate timely processing. Please note that Scantrons cannot be submitted through interoffice mail and will not be picked up at examinations sites by TLS.

Our office hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday between Dec 10 and 21. For the convenience of those with exams scheduled on December 22, TLS will extend its office hours until 6:30 p.m. on that specific day. Any Scantrons dropped off before 6:30 p.m. on December 22 will be processed before the holiday closure on December 23. Exam processing will resume on January 4.

To expedite the drop-off process, please ensure you have completed the <u>Scantron Scanning Request Form</u> accurately, including the correct count of the Scantrons you are submitting. This form cannot be submitted electronically; it must be printed and submitted along with the physical Scantrons. Also, please ensure the Scantrons are stacked face up with the timing tracks on the left-hand side and completed answer key(s) on top.



#### Final Grade Submission: Fall 2023

The Fall 2023 term comes to an end on December 8, 2023, and the final examination period runs from December 10-22, 2023. This marks the beginning of the grade submission period.

All final grade submissions are expected to be submitted and approved as soon as grading is complete, and in all cases within 10 calendar days of the final exam or takehome exam due date. Courses without an exam are due 10 calendar days after the last

day of classes. For your reference, the due date for your course is displayed within E-Grades – at both the Final grades menu and in your final grade roster.

# Brightspace Update: Wrapping up Fall and Looking Ahead to Winter

#### Wrapping up the fall term

- <u>Schedule a consultation</u> with TLS staff for help with gradebook questions or to review your settings.
- Communicate with your students by <u>emailing from the Brightspace Classlist</u> if the course end date has passed. Brightspace announcements will not be distributed after course end dates.
- Follow these instructions to <u>grade assignments</u> and <u>quizzes</u>, setup your <u>gradebook</u>, and <u>export your grades to E-grades</u>.
- If you require assistance submitting your final grades, visit the <u>E-Grades support</u> page for an instructor manual and FAQ.

#### Looking ahead to the winter term

- Consult the course setup guide to ensure you include all the important course elements.
- Merge your courses before adding content if you're teaching multiple sections of the same course.
- Create a course overview tour to help your students navigate your Brightspace course.
- Activate your course to allow students access as courses are hidden by default when they are created.
- Update Zoom to the latest version to ensure you have access to the newest features, fixes and settings.


