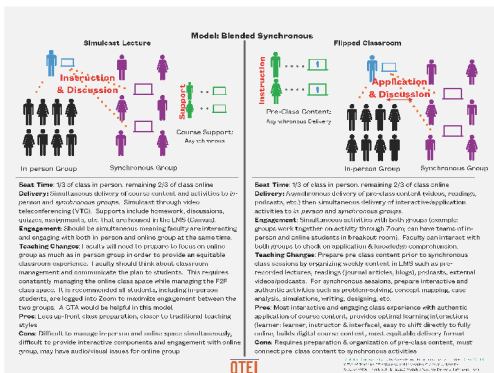


Academic Models for 2020-2021

Blended / Hybrid courses

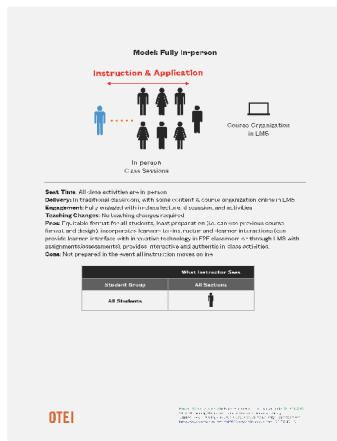

"Traditional" fully in-person courses

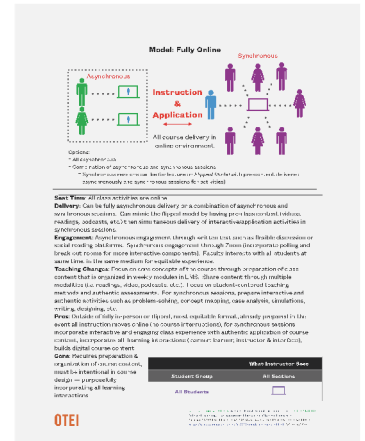
offered with social distancing and masks but with enough room capacity so that students can physically attend each class. An online component is always available. See the graphic below.

Fully Online

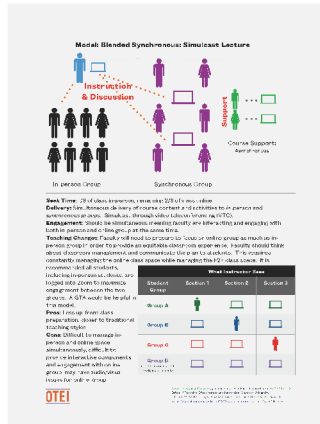

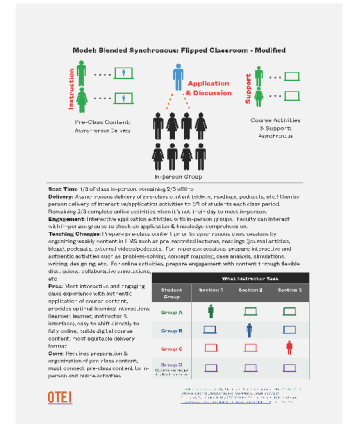

Blended: Simulcast Lecture



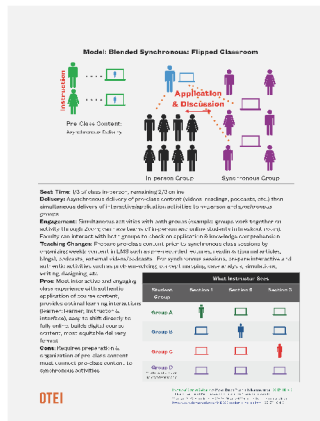

Blended: Flipped Classroom (Modified)



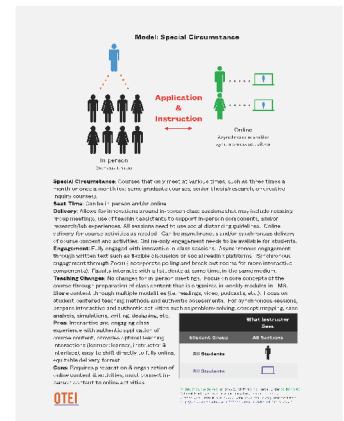
