Support for the Return to In-Person Teaching and Learning

Looking for support teaching your winter term classes? The staff at Teaching and Learning Services (TLS) are here to help, whether you're teaching synchronously or asynchronously, HyFlex, online or face-to-face.

- Media services: record course lectures on campus in our Classroom Studios, request a technician edit or chunk existing Classroom Studio recordings and more
