There are many things to look forward to this fall. Construction has begun on the <u>Future Learning Lab</u>. Located on the fourth floor of the MacOdrum Library, the lab will provide numerous opportunities for our instructors, students and staff to collaborate and innovate. In addition to a completely overhauled space, the lab will host a variety of programming, awards and grants, including our undergraduate research program, <u>I-CUREUS</u>, and our <u>Students as Partners</u> <u>Program</u>, which gives students the chance to partner with an instructor on teaching innovation projects and course design.

Exciting new programs and services will also be hosted in the Future Learning Lab, including the establishment of teaching innovation grants and a new student skills development certificate that will build off the success of the original <u>FUSION modules</u>, helping Carleton students become the next generation of citizen scholars. We will also be experimenting with educational technologies that will enable more flexible approaches to experiential learning. Stay tuned for more to come on that score.

Teaching Resources and Support This Term

As the fall term gets underway, remember that we can provide a variety of support to help you design and deliver your courses.

In order to meet the diverse needs of our community, we will be offering limited services in-person, in addition to remotely via phone, email and webconferencing tools. We are not able to support ad hoc, in person drop-in consultations on the fourth floor of Dunton Tower. If you need to meet with a team member or get support onsite, please complete our <u>course consultation request form</u> and we would be happy to meet with you in person.

Whether you need <u>educational technology support</u> for tools including Brightspace, Kaltura Mediaspace, Poll Everywhere and Zoom, or would like a <u>classroom</u> <u>orientation</u> to familiarize yourself with the room you're teaching, we can help! We also provide <u>equipment</u> <u>loans</u> if you or your teaching assistant need additional tools to teach your courses, and can <u>record your course</u> <u>introduction or a mini-lecture</u> in one of our classroom studios.

Important Dates and Updates for the Fall Term

As the fall term begins, there are several important dates to keep in mind:

- Course outlines must be made available by Oct. 24 to students registered in late fall courses.
- Formally scheduled full and late-summer term deferred final examinations will be held Sept. 23 to 25. Early fall undergraduate deferred final examinations will be held Nov. 18 to 20.
- Carleton students will have a week-long break from Oct. 24 to 28. No classes will take place during this time. Students cannot be required to attend class or submit coursework from Oct. 22 to 30. If exceptional circumstances necessitate holding a test after Friday, Oct. 21, such a test can only be scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 22 and must be announced on the course outline distributed at the beginning of the term.
- Remembrance Day is on Friday, Nov. 11. As much as possible, course instructors are asked to allow for a moment of silence for personal reflection at 11 a.m. in accordance with Senate policy.

Scantron Processing at TLS

Brightspace Training for Contract Instructors

Carleton University is providing paid Brightspace training for eligible contract instructors. Upon completion, participants will be paid a **one-time sum** of \$120 (three hours of training). Payment for completion is processed once per academic term.

To enroll in the Brightspace Basics self-paced online

course, please <u>authenticate into this form</u> using your MyCarletonOne credentials. This self-paced course is the only option for eligible contract instructors to receive payment for completing Brightspace training.

Once you have completed the course modules, you will get an email indicating that you'll be paid in the next payment cycle, usually at the end of September, January and April.

Additionally, contract instructors are welcome and encouraged to make use of all the freely available resources to support course design and delivery in Brightspace, including:
