



Supporting Those Struggling With Mental Health

Sue felt broken after the death of her son. She needed relief from the pain and guilt that overwhelmed her. United Way made it possible for Sue to access counselling and process the trauma she was facing. Because she no longer feels alone, Sue says: "I feel lighter, somehow."

Because of your organization's investments, people like **Sue** have a place to turn for help when they need it most.

The stigma associated with mental health problems often keeps people from seeking help. When a person is ready to reach out for the first time, it's important that someone is there to listen and provide effective, professional guidance.

Thanks to your organization, United Way is able to fund programs and initiatives like 24/7 crisis lines, counselling and peer support groups—the psychological and crisis supports people need, when they need it most.

Helping Children and Youth

Kuma's guidance counsellor recommended her for the Students Will All Graduate (SWAG) after school program because she was considered "at-risk" as a result of growing up in a low-income neighbourhood.

"I know now that if I didn't have a program like SWAG, it would've been really hard for me to make it as far as I've come. I grew from someone who didn't have confidence in my ability to succeed in school, into someone with the world at my fingertips," says Kuma.

Thanks to your organization, United Way is able to support youth like **Kuma** so they can reach their full potential.

When you help kids develop the skills they need to succeed in school, you put them on the path to a successful life—which will pay dividends for generations to come. At United Way, we believe that every child and youth across Ottawa deserves an equal opportunity to be all that they can be.

Here's a look at what we were able to accomplish together in 2017-18:



- 7,603 youth participated in out-ofschool time programs and/or received individualized supports
- **704** children and youth maintained or improved their academic performance


Additionally, we were able to support our city's most vulnerable youth and their families in diverse ways. Here's how you helped:

- 14,958 youth participated in substance use prevention and education sessions
- **97** youth reported a reduction in the frequency of drug use

Moving People from Poverty to Possibility

When **TJ** moved to Ottawa to escape his difficult past, he found himself without a network of support—he had no job and no family or friends to fall back on, so he ended up sleeping on couches, in garages and in emergency shelters.

After connecting with a United Way partner, TJ accessed employment counselling and skill-building resources to overcome the barriers he faced. Soon after, TJ landed a full-time job with a local social enterprise that offers employment supports to those who need it. With a steady paycheque, TJ says he feels more independent and hopeful for his future.

Thanks to your support, we were able to move people like **TJ** from poverty to possibility.

Without the basic necessities, life becomes a daily struggle. A place to call home, a job and a sense of belonging to your community are basic needs that we all want for ourselves, our loved ones and our neighbours.

Thanks to donors like you, we invest in programs and initiatives that help newcomers find jobs to match their skills and give people with disabilities employment and a sense of belonging to their community.

Here's a glimpse into what that achievement looked like in 2017-18 with the support of donors like you:




1,012 job seekers with disabilities found employment

Supporting Seniors

Mary was diagnosed with glaucoma at age 72 and found out she would lose more and more of her vision as she got older. With support from a United Way partner that provides services for the blind and partially sighted, Mary developed new ways to maintain her independence and regain self-confidence. Now, Mary teaches braille to her peers, and runs a support group for other seniors who are losing their vision.


There are now more people aged 65 or older living in Ottawa than there are children and youth. Between 2011 and 2031, our senior population is expected to more than double. We know what the challenges look like today, and they will only grow if we don't work collaboratively to support this vulnerable population:


- **30%** of seniors live in poverty in some Ottawa neighbourhoods
- 26% of Ottawa seniors live alone, making them more vulnerable to social isolation

Engaging Your Employees

Through United Way, your organization can participate in volunteer and engagement opportunities that bring staff together and increase employee recruitment, engagement and retention.


United Way has the expertise to create customized employee engagement experiences for your team, such as:

Make it to Midnight Challenge: Employees can participate in a make-it-to-midnight session, where they will experience a live tour, held between 6:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. Here, they will experience first-hand the challenges that homeless youth face. Participants then share their experience with fellow staff, through a post-event workplace event or through a filmed video presentation prepared by United Way. This event offers an eye-opening view of our city and an unforgettable life experience to participants.

Simulation Experience: Medium to large-sized staff groups can participate in a custom simulation experience on topics such as homelessness or mental health crises. To begin, staff break into small teams, and learn the story of a person who has benefitted from United Way's support. For the next hour, they live out the person's story, making important decisions along the way. At the end of the simulation, participants learn how these real people in Ottawa overcame their challenges.

Single Day Volunteering Projects: United Way can create and deliver customized volunteer experiences for employees looking to have a hands-on impact in a specific area. This can include kit-building for vulnerable people (such as personal care kits for homeless youth), landscaping and restoration projects, neighbourhood support, tutoring, and many other options. The scope of the activity can be tailored to the size of the group and the ideal date/time. Depending on the activity, some extra costs may apply.

Skills-based Volunteering: United Way engages volunteers each year to solve specific, community-based challenges across the city. Organizations with human resources expertise can participate in mock interviews with people who have disabilities and are looking for their first job. Those with accounting skills can help people with financial planning challenges. And those able to offer legal help are engaged to offer advice to many in need, particularly Ottawa's refugee communities.

Leading the Way in Financial Performance


During the most recent reporting year, United Way Ottawa raised \$26,241,526. Of this, 84 per cent of our funds were allocated to charitable programs and grants, and the remaining funds went toward management expenses and fundraising. From the total amount raised, donors and grant makers gave \$11.6M to support United Way-led initiatives in the community.

United Way Ottawa is proud to have been recognized by external bodies for our strong financial performance. This has included consistent top marks in MoneySense magazine for how we use our funds.
